In Memoriam for Reed S. Britt 1930 - 2014

Reed S. Britt, Jr. was born on January 13, 1930 in Gwinnett County, Georgia where he spent most of his life. Reed was educated in the public schools of Gwinnett County. He served in the United States Marine Corps during the Korean conflict. He was later employed by General Motors in Doraville and retired from the company after many years of service. He was a member of Pleasant Hill Baptist Church. He was also very active in Masonic work. He was a Past Master of Sweetwater Lodge No. 421, F. & A.M. He served as High Priest of Sweetwater Chapter No. 49, Royal Arch Masons and as Illustrious Master of Gwinnett Council No. 44, Royal and Select Masters. Reed was a recipient of the Order of the Silver Trowel and the Holy Order of High Priesthood. He served as Eminent Commander of Arnold de Troye Commandery No. 31, Knights Templar and was a recipient of the Knights Templar Cross of Honor and the Knight Commander of the Temple Award. He was a member and Past Registrar of Cherokee Rose Priory No. 56, Knights of the York Cross of Honour. Reed was a member and Past Governor of Luther G. Palmer York Rite College No. 123. He was also a member of Upper Room Tabernacle No. 45, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests in Macon. Reed served for many years on the Credentials Committee of the Grand York Rite Bodies. He laid down the Sword of Templary and the Working Tools of Masonry on September 8, 2014 and ascended to the Asylum on High. He was preceded in death by his first wife Lois Alma Keever Britt. Survivors include his second wife Marty Hobson Britt of Norcross; children, Reed S. Britt, III and wife Cheryl of Monroe; Angela Britt of Madison; Alma Morrow of Oxford; Tina and husband Anthony Smith of Lawrenceville; eight grandchildren and four great grandchildren. While we shall see him not again on this earthly plane, we will cherish his memory; the great example he set before us and the warm and friendly smile with which he always greeted us. In Memoriam for WILFORD HENRY HALL 1927- 2014

On this occasion, let us pause to commemorate and honor the memory of one very illustrious within our craft of Freemasonry...WILFORD HENRY HALL. Brother, Companion, and Sir Knight Bill Hall, as he was known in the York Rite, was born in Dalton, Whitfield County, Georgia on February 28, 1927, the son of Mathew Robert and Grace Rymer Hall. He attended the Dalton Public Schools, the Murray County Public Schools, and graduated from Dalton High School. Companion Bill married the former Betty Goss of Dalton, Georgia, and at the time of his passing they were in their 67th year of matrimony. To that union was born a daughter Donna, who is now Mrs. Douglas Knowles, and the mother of Bill and Betty's grandchildren...Dr. Rebecca Knowles of Chatsworth and Darian and wife, Sara, Knowles of Omaha, Nebraska, together with Bill and Betty's greatgrandson Anaiah. Sir Knight Bill served in the United States Navy during the latter part of World War II in the Pacific Theater of Operations. Following active service during the war, he returned to the Dalton area but remained a member of the Ready Reserve. He served in a number of positions with the Reserve, both in Dalton and Chattanooga, Tennessee. He retired from the Naval Reserve a full commander after thirty-seven years of service. Brother Bill was employed with the North Georgia Electric Membership Corporation, where he rose to the position of Operating Superintendent. He retired following thirty-six years of faithful service. Among his civic activities, Companion Bill served six years as a member of the Board of Directors of the United Way of Northwest Georgia. He was a member of the Kiwanis Club of Dalton, Inc., where he served as treasurer for several years. He was recognized as Kiwanian of the Year in 1984. He served as a member of the Vocational Training Advisory Board of Dalton College. He served on the Board of Directors of the Home Builders Association of Dalton. And, of course, he was a life member and first President of the Naval Reserve Officers Association of Chattanooga, Tennessee; and a life member of the Naval Reserve Officers of the United States. In his Masonic life, Brother Hall was initiated as an Entered Apprentice on April 27, 1959, passed to the degree of Fellowcraft on May 11, 1959, and raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason on June 8, 1959 in Dalton Lodge No. 105, F. &A.M. in Dalton, Georgia. He served as Worshipful Master of Dalton Lodge No. 105, F. &A. M. in 1965, and served as Worshipful Master of the 43rd Tri-County Masonic Convention in 1985-86. He was twice elected as "Master Mason of the Year" from his Lodge. Companion Bill was exalted to the most sublime degree of the Holy Royal Arch in Western Chapter No. 80, R.A.M. on October 22, 1959. He served as High Priest of his Chapter in 1966 and received the Order of the High Priesthood. He served as District Grand Deputy to the Grand High Priest for several years. Companion Hall was greeted as a Royal and Select Master in Walton C. Griffin Council No. 36, R. &S.M. in Dalton, Georgia, on July 21, 1960. He served as Illustrious Master in 1979 and 1980. He was awarded the Cryptic Mason of the Year Award in 1980, and served as Thrice Illustrious Master of the Georgia Council of the Order of the Silver Trowel in 1988-89. Knighted in St. Johns' Commander No. 19. K.T., on October 29, 1977, Sir Knight Hall served as Eminent Commander of St. John's Commandery in 1979-80. He was elected to the Grand Commandery Line in 1981, and was installed as Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Georgia, K.T., for the year 1989-90. He received the Knight Crusader of the Cross under the auspices of the Grand Commandery of Florida in 1990. In related Masonic bodies, Companion and Sir Knight Hall was a member and Past Prior of Cherokee Rose Priory No. 56, Knights of the York Cross of Honor. He was a charter member and past Governor of Luther G.

Palmer York Rite College; a Past Sovereign Master of Rufus R. White Conclave No. 310, Allied Masonic Degrees; a Past Excellent Chief of Carl F. Lester, Jr. Council No. 65, Knight Masons; a member and Past Preceptor of Upper Room Tabernacle No XLV, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests; and a member and Past Sovereign of Rufus R. White Conclave of the Red Cross of Constantine. A total Freemason, Illustrious and Brother Hall received the degrees of Scottish Rite Masonry up to the 32nd on June 7, 1986, in the Valley of Atlanta, Orient of Georgia. He was decorated as a Knight Commander Court of Honor on October 18, 1993, and was Coroneted as a 33rd Degree, Inspector General Honorary of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry of the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States of America on November 13, 1999, Brother. Companion, and Sir Knight Wilford Henry "Bill" Hall may best be described as one of those brethren worthy of being addressed as "Mr. Mason." His years of service to the craft exhibit a record rarely paralleled within our fraternity. His reputation as a Masonic ritualist is second to none. Whether it was in the role of the third ruffian of the Master's Degree, the Master Overseer of the Mark Master's Degree, or his well-known portrayal of Nebuzaradan, Grand Captain of the Persian Armies, his performances made a lasting impression upon all who witnessed his work. He was known for arising very early, loading his automobile with equipment and paraphernalia, and driving hundreds of miles to confer the work on any number of candidates, be it a house full or a hand full. However, beyond his service to Freemasonry, is a record of his kindness, generosity, and compassion for his fellowmen. He was noted for many, many kindly deeds and courtesies that marked him as a lover of all mankind. Whether it was unexpectedly providing treats or refreshments or other accommodations for the employees, who worked under him, or whether it was presenting gifts to friends or strangers, alike, of any of the many artsy things that he made himself, or whether it was providing some assistance to needy persons of his acquaintance, Bill Hall cared about people. He was a Christian gentleman and practiced his faith during the course of his walk through life as well as being a member of the South Dalton Baptist Church. We shall miss Brother, Companion, and Sir Knight Wilford Henry "Bill" Hall, but his memory shall dwell within our hearts until we meet again in the Great Beyond.

Projected Per Capita to be collected for the 2015-16 Budgeted Year is \$65,355.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1) That each Chapter re-write their By-Laws, using the adopted STANDARD FORMAT, and submit them to this Office for approval and placement in the Grand Chapter archives.
- 2) That each York Rite Mason actively assist their Chapter Officers in stemming the NPD hemorrhaging and bring those who have departed via NPD back into the fold.

REPORT OF CHARTERS & BY-LAWS COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Grand Officers, and Members of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Georgia: Your committee on Charters and By-Laws wishes to make the following report: We recommend the approval of the complete revisions of the By-Laws of Douglasville Chapter No.

50, which were actually adopted in 2013. Your Committee approves the amendment to the bylaws of Taylor Chapter No. 48, RA M. changing the annual dues and fees charged for degrees and changing the meeting date to a Thursday. Your Committee approves the amendment to the bylaws of Pythagoras Chapter No.10, changing the meeting date to a different Thursday. Your Committee approves the amendment to the bylaws of William J. Penn, Jr. Chapter No.15 changing the meeting date from a Thursday to a Monday. Your Committee believes the amendment to the bylaws of Newnan Chapter No.34, changing the arrangement of the meeting date to a rotational basis with the Council and Commandery may be confusing, but will approve the amendment as submitted. Your Committee approves the amendment to the bylaws of Alleghaney Chapter No. 64, changing the annual dues and fees charged for degrees. Your Committee notes that the Charter of Alapaha Chapter No.79 in Nashville, was surrendered on December 11, 2014. The members were all issued Demits by the Grand Secretary's office, except those members who belonged to the Council or Commandery in Tifton or Valdosta and they were affiliated with the chapter in Tifton or Valdosta, depending on where their membership was. Your Committee notes that the Charter of Columbian Chapter No. 136 in Washington, with a membership of 41, was declared forfeited as of December 31, 2014. The members were all issued Demits by the Grand Secretary's office, except the 14 Emeritus Members. Oliver Chapter No. 25, at Elberton, graciously agreed to take the 14 Emeritus Members, many whom had 35 - 40 years as members. Your Committee thanks Oliver Chapter No. 25 and its Secretary, Tony Dickerson, for this favor. Your Committee notes that The Grand High Priest has issued His Dispensation #4 to allow Western Chapter No. 80 in Dalton to change their name to Wilford H. Hall Chapter No. 80 effective January 1, 2015. Your Committee recommends approval of this name change. Your Committee notes that Zerubbabel Chapter No. 131 at Quitman was consolidated with Valdosta Chapter No. 107 on December 1, 2014. Your Committee notes that The Grand High Priest has issued His Dispensation #5 to allow Valdosta Chapter No. 107 to change their name to Valdosta - Zerubbabel Chapter No. 107 effective March 2, 2015. Your Committee recommends approval of this name change. This Committee has received no requests for new Chapter charters. However, we note that for good and sufficient cause, the Most Excellent Grand High Priest has issued His Dispensation on March 4, 2015 authorizing certain Companions, exceeding the required 9 in number, to meet as a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons under the name of Moultrie Chapter U. D. in the city of Moultrie, County of Colquitt. We therefore recommend that this Dispensation continue until the next annual Convocation, unless sooner terminated by the Most Excellent Grand High Priest or by the Companions, when they may wish to apply for a charter.

provided, however, that a written copy of the motion so to revise, amend or alter, shall be filed with the Grand Secretary by March 1st. Provided further, that with the unanimous consent of the Members present, any member may introduce such an amendment in writing, on the first day of the Annual Convocation, and before the election of Officers has been concluded.

So that said section as amended shall read as follows: Section 2.10.2.5 Membership as Between Old and New Chapters: The members of a Chapter under Dispensation continue to be members of the Chapter to which they belonged when the dispensation was granted. Any Petitioner for a Dispensation for a new Chapter may sever his connection with such new Chapter at any time before a Charter is granted by notice to the Grand Secretary, and the new Chapter, and his Certificate of Good Standing or Demit shall be returned; and his membership shall remain with his former Chapter. Whenever the new Chapter is chartered and constituted, the members immediately become members of the new Chapters, and their membership in the former Chapter ceases without the necessity of obtaining a demit. Such member may signify their desire to hold dual membership and they will continue as dual members. The Secretary of the new Chapter shall notify the Secretary of the former Chapter to which the Companion belonged of their intention to hold dual membership.

Bill No. 6 Defeated

A BILL, to amend Section 2.10.5.2 of the Grand Chapter Code of Georgia relating to Suspension for Non-Payment by deleting said section and substituting a new section therein.

BE IT ENACTED by the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Georgia that Code Section 2.10.5.2 be deleted in its entirety and a new section substituted therein. So that said section as amended shall read as follows: Section 2.10.5.2 Suspension for Non-Payment of Dues. A Companion in arrears for dues for six (6) months may be suspended, after due notice, without trial. If said dues together with fee for restoration are paid within twelve (12) months from such suspension, he shall be reinstated automatically; if more than twelve (12) months elapse before payment, the reinstatement must be by petition and unanimous secret ballot. This Legislation to revise Suspension for Non-Payment of Dues, if adopted, shall be effective beginning on January 1, 2016.

During the last two years, we have issued challenges to the Conventions and they have exceeded those challenges each year. The challenges next year will be the same - beat what you gave in 2014/15. Dr. Musiek is now at the University of Arizona and receives \$60,000.00. Hearing Health Foundation is awarded a \$120,000.00 grant and gives those monies to (4) M.D.'s or Ph.D.'s - \$30,000 each for CAPD Research. Autism Speaks receives a Grant of \$100,000.00 for their Toddlers Program. This involves the testing of infants from 12 to 36 months of age for both Autism and for CAPD. I am not going to try to give the total of each District, but I note once again that the 5th with another donation from Mt. Zion #16 of

\$4,000.00 was around \$4,200.00. The 9th beat last year with \$1,800.00 this year. Last year at Grand Chapter, we passed the baskets and collected \$708.00 for RARA. I would like to do the same this year and challenge you to beat last year. I ask you to save your change or at least all of your pennies to give to your Chapter or Convention and let's try to top the \$14,026.00 next year. - 1. We would request each Chapter and Council in Georgia to prepare a history and submit it to the Committee. So much history is out there and some of it is now lost due to the ravages of time and deaths.
- 2. We also request that any York Rite Mason prepare a paper on any subject regarding notable Companions, historical or informational Topics and forward them to the Committee. These papers could be published or distributed for the benefit of York Rite Masonry in Georgia.

- The Committee recommends that each Chapter and Council have an educational Program during the year for the benefit of the Companions.
- 4. The Committee wishes a Happy 177th Birthday to Constantine Chapter No.4 in Macon. It was chartered September 14, 1838 by the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, while the Grand Chapter of Georgia was asleep during the Morgan Affair. Washington Council No.6 in Macon is also celebrating its 172nd Birthday, being chartered February 14, 1843, by the Grand Council of Georgia. 5. The Committee also wishes a Happy 170th Birthday to Cherokee Chapter No. 13 in Marietta. It was chartered May 5, 1845. I also had the privilege of appointing District Deputies to the Grand Council, with James W. Tate as the State Chairman. Thank all of you for your hard work.

CRYPTIC MASONS MEDICAL RESEARCH FOUNDATION

The General Grand Council's charitable arm, Cryptic Masons Medical Research Foundation (CMMRF) is working very hard to find cures for several diseases (Heart Disease, Diabetes, Arthritis, Blindness, Peripheral Artery and Vascular Disease, Wound Healing, COPD/lung Disease and Erectile Dysfunction). On behalf of the Grand Council of Georgia, I thank each of you for your generous contributions to our Charity especially those Constituent Councils that contributed at least one dollar per member and the Council Conventions for their offerings.

RECOMMENDATIONS

After traveling across the State observing, participating in Degrees, and fellowshipping with the Companions, I respectfully make the following recommendations:

- That all Companions contribute at least \$1.00 per capita per year to CMMRF, either directly or through our Constituent Councils, District Conventions, or a combination of such.
- That the Grand Council continue to sponsor Annual Schools of Instruction in Macon, and/or District Conventions conducted by the Custodians in the North and South. These schools should cover the opening and closing on the Royal and Select Masters Degrees as well as the conferral of the Degrees.
- That our Constituent Councils practice regularly and make every effort to open and close in full form without use of the Ritual Book. This may solidify and enhance our knowledge of the numerous lessons set forth in the Ritual.

 That our Constituent Councils continue to reach out to our Blue Lodges, by presenting Programs to educate our Brother Master Masons as to the additional light available in York Rite Masonry.

STATE OF THE CRAFT

Traveling to various parts of the State, I have found the Craft to be sound. Some Councils open regularly in full form with little help from the Ritual Book, while some struggle to open. Councils are growing, we delivered Covenant Council No. 83's Charter in Warner Robins last October and issued dispensations to Moultrie Council and the 11th District Council Convention this spring. To the Most Illustrious Grand Master, Grand Officers, and Members of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of the State of Georgia: Your committee on Charters and By-Laws wishes to make the following Report: We recommend the approval of the updated revision of the By-Laws of Graydon W. Kitchens Council No.18, R S. M which basically only changes the dues and fees payable. We recommend the approval of the of the By-Laws of Covenant Council No. 83, RSM, which were submitted to show the actual name and number of the Council after it was Chartered. We recommend the approval of the complete revisions of the By-Laws of Douglasville Council No. 37, RSM, which were actually adopted in 2013. Your Committee approves the amendment to the By-laws of N. T. Pirkle Council No. 65, RSM changing the annual dues and fees charged for degrees and changing the meeting date to a Thursday. Your Committee approves the amendment to the By-laws of Griffin Council No.8, RS. M. changing the meeting date to a different Thursday. Your Committee approves the amendment to the By-laws of Hugh L. Smith Council No.7 changing the meeting date from a Thursday to a Monday. Your Committee approves the amendment to the By-laws of Zabud Council No.64, R S. M. changing the annual dues and fees charged for degrees. Your Committee believes the amendment to the By-laws of Hiram Council No.62, RS. M. changing the arrangement of the meeting date to a rotational basis with the Chapter and Commandery may be confusing, but will approve the amendment as submitted. We recommend the approval of the complete revision of the By-Laws of Hunter Council No. 20, R S. M. which also includes a change in the meeting place from Quitman, Georgia, to Thomasville, Georgia. The Most Illustrious Grand Master issued a Dispensation dated October 30, 2014 for the Council to begin meeting there. Your Committee notes that for good and sufficient cause, the Most Illustrious Grand Master has issued His Dispensation on February 17, 2015 authorizing the Council Companions of the Eleventh District, to meet as a District Council of Royal and Select Masters under the name of Eleventh District Council Convention. We have reviewed the By-Laws of the newly formed Eleventh District Council Convention of Royal and Select Masters and find nothing in conflict with the Grand Council Code. We wish them much success in the future. This Committee has received no requests for new Councils. However, we note that for good and sufficient cause, the Most Illustrious Grand Master has issued His Dispensation on March 4, 2015 authorizing certain Companions, exceeding the required 9 in number, to meet as a Council of Royal and Select Masters under the name of Moultrie Council U. D. in the City of Moultrie, County of Colquitt. We therefore recommend that this Dispensation continue until the next annual Assembly, unless sooner terminated by the Most Illustrious Grand Master or by the Companions, when they may wish to apply for a charter.

No Rulings or Edicts have been made by the Most Illustrious Grand Master to be reviewed by the committee on Jurisprudence to determine whether in proper legal form and not in conflict with any section of the Code. The Dispensations issued by the Most Illustrious Grand Master were reviewed and found to be in proper legal Form and not in conflict with any section of the Grand Council Code. The Committee recommends approval of the same. The Members of the Committee wish to thank the Most Illustrious Grand Master for the opportunity to serve in this capacity.

REPORT OF THE CRYPTIC MASONS MEDICAL RESEARCH FOUNDATION

To the Officers and Companions of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Georgia: The Indiana Center for Vascular Biology and Medicine (ICVBM) continues to lead the way in studying the use of Stem Cells derived from Adipose Tissue (fat) and Bone Marrow in the treatment of many debilitating Diseases. The current areas of research include: Heart Disease, Diabetes, Blindness, COPD/Lung Disease, Regenerative Medicine, Peripheral Artery and Vascular Disease, Wound Healing, Erectile Dysfunction, and Hemophilia Arthritis. This past year the Researchers at ICVBM have partnered with Terry Loghmani PhD, PT of the Laboratory of Applied Regenerative Medicine to enhance the application of Regenerative Medicine and Rehabilitative Medicine to improve Clinical outcomes for Patients with a wide variety of Conditions. For many years, Cryptic Masons have provided the lion's share of the Funding for the Research of the treatment of the conditions listed above. Only 4 per cent of the Funding for this research comes from Government Entities, Georgia Cryptic Masons have for many years been among the leaders in contributions to the CMMRF. In 2014 we ranked 19th Nationally in Donations, contributing \$3,385 to CMMRF. Plagues for the \$1000.00 level in Donations were presented to the following York Rite Bodies in Georgia: Luther G. Palmer York Rite College No. 123. Extender Bars for Plaques representing an additional \$1000.00 in Donations were presented to: Georgia Council #2; and Walton C. Griffin Council #36. ADDRESS OF THE RIGHT EMINENT GRAND COMMANDER

The Grand Commander followed a long list of Grand Commanders who have worn the Whiteside Jewel proudly upon their Breasts. This Jewel signifies dignity and respect to the highest degree. REPORT OF THE CHARTERS AND BY-LAWS COMMITTEE

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Officers, and Members of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Georgia: Your committee on Charters, By-Laws, and Dispensations wishes to make the following Report: Your Committee is in receipt of a complete set of bylaws for Blue Ridge Mountain Commandery No.37 that were amended in 2013, but which do not appear to have been approved by this Committee. The Committee approves the stating of the meeting place in the By-Laws and the changing of the dues payable. Your Committee notes that the By-Laws provide for a stated Conclave on the 4th Monday of each month and also on Good Friday each year, with the election of Officers on that date. Your Committee approves that! The Committee suggests that the Commandery consider deleting Section 3, Article VI, pertaining to Life Memberships as this is no longer applicable. Additionally, Section I-D and I-E of Article X should be re- written or deleted as the Commandery cannot limit a Sir Knight's ability to acquire his own uniform from the market-place. Your Committee approves the amendment to the by-laws of Amicalola Commandery No.41, changing the annual dues and possible assessments, if any. This Change was actually made in 2013. Your Committee approves the amendment to the By-Laws of Pilgrim Commandery No.15, changing the fees charged for degrees. Your Committee approves the amendments to the By-Laws of Tancred Commandery No. 11, changing the meeting dates, and fees charged for degrees. While there does appear to be a conflict in the Grand Commandery Code, that requires each Commandery to hold their annual Conclave in March, (Article I, Section 2), the Code only requires that each Commandery meet quarterly (Article III, Section 1). Tancred Commandery will have their annual Conclave in February, since it does not meet in March. This Committee has received no requests for new Commandery Charters. However, we note that for good and sufficient cause, the Right Eminent Grand Commander has issued His Dispensation on March 4, 2015 authorizing certain Sir Knights, exceeding the required 9 in number, to meet as a Commandery of Knights Templar, under the name of Calvary Commandery U. D. in the City of Moultrie, County of Colquitt. We therefore recommend that this Dispensation continue until the next annual Conclave, unless sooner terminated by the Right Eminent Grand Commander or by the Sir Knights, when they may wish to apply for a charter. BILL 2 Adopted

A BILL, to amend Article I, Section 3 of the Constituent Commanderies Section of the Grand Commandery Code of Georgia relating to Returns and Dues by deleting the first two Paragraphs in their entirety and substituting a new two paragraphs therein. BE IT ENACTED by the Grand Commandery of the State of Georgia that Article I, of the Constituent Commanderies Section, Section 3, Returns and Dues, be amended by deleting the first two Paragraphs and substituting a new Section 3, Returns and Dues, first two Paragraphs, so that when amended, Section 3, first two paragraphs, will read:

SECTION 3, RETURNS AND DUES. Every Constituent Commandery shall pay to the Grand Commandery by remittance to the Grand Recorder, the following fees for its members

- 1. \$20.00 for every Sir Knight who is a member of said Commandery on the last day of December
- \$7.00 for each Sir Knight who received the Order of the Temple in the preceding year.
- 3. \$7.00 for each Sir Knight reinstated in the preceding year.
- 4. \$1.00 per Sir Knight for every Sir Knight who is not a life sponsor.
- 5. \$9.00 per Sir Knight, which is the current assessed, Per Capita Tax or fee that Grand Encampment charges per Sir Knight. No Sir Knight shall be exempted. The monthly Report for December 2015 and each year thereafter, must be in the Grand Recorder's Office not later than January 10th following, and all Per Capita Tax must be paid on or before March 1. Commanderies failing to make such payment shall be assessed ten per cent (10) penalty for such delinquency. Respectfully submitted

REPORT OF THE KTEF, DIV. OF GA., THE KTEF, Inc. AND THE MOLLIE S. MOSELEY EYE FOUNDATION TRUST OF GEORGIA, Inc.

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Georgia: This Committee is charged with the responsibility of administering the funds of the Knights Templar Educational Foundation, Division of Georgia, and the funds of our solely owned Corporation, Knights Templar Educational Foundation of Georgia, Inc. and the funds of the Mollie S. Moseley Eye Foundation Trust of Georgia, Inc. The Division funds, which are controlled by rules and regulations of the Grand Encampment allowed the committee to award five \$1000 scholarships to deserving students to further their education. The Corporation funds, controlled by the Trustees, permitted \$42.000-gifts to Emory University and the Medical College of Georgia; and Ministerial Gifts of \$1.500

each to Denise Haskins and Zandra Jordan of Emory University's Candler School of Theology. The Mollie S. Moseley Eye Foundation Trust of Georgia funds are invested with only the interest used and sent to the Knights Templar Eye Foundation. \$10.000 was sent this year to allow the purchase of another Golden Chalice. We are pleased to report that the Knights Templar Educational Foundation, Division of Georgia, funds has a present net worth of over \$250,000. The present net worth of our solely owned Corporation, Knights Templar Educational Foundation of Georgia, Inc. funds is over 3.5 million and the Mollie S. Moseley Foundation Trust of Georgia stands at just over half a million. Since REPGC Clyde E. Griffin's term on the Committee expires at this Grand Convocation, this Committee recommends that the Grand Commander nominate and the Grand Commandery approve REPGC Griffin to succeed himself for a five-year term on the Committee, expiring in 2018. He has designed a self-adhesive, digital, high resolution, vinyl (Avery SuperCast) color, wall image of the York Rite Degrees, to include the Blue Lodge, which he hopes at some point to distribute to all lodges. This, of course, would require either private or public funding from some source, and the Committee makes no recommendation relative to the source of such funding at this time. The Educational and Historical Committee of the Grand Commandery joins with the Educational and Historical Committee of the Grand Chapter and Grand Council in making the following recommendations for consideration of Knights Templars of Georgia:

1. We request that each Commandery prepare and submit a History to the Committee. So much history is being lost due to the ravages of time and deaths. 2. We encourage any Knight Templar to prepare a paper on any subject regarding notable Sir Knights, historical or informational topics and forward them to the Committee. These papers could be published and distributed for the benefit of York Rite Masonry in general, but the Grand Commandery in particular. 3. The Committee recommends that each Commandery have an Educational Program during the year for the benefit of the Sir Knights. In closing, the Committee notes that one of our Members, Right Eminent Sir Knight Bobby Joe Townsend, Right Eminent Past Grand Commander, passed the veil of this mortal existence, this year, and entered into the realm of the Supreme Commandery of the Universe. While he will be missed by all the Sir Knights in this Grand Jurisdiction, his knowledge and wisdom will be especially missed by this Committee as it continues to function on behalf of Templary in Georgia. We ask that all sir Knights continue to remember Right Eminent Sir Knight Townsend's family in your prayers.

To: Constituent Commanderies Grand Commandery Officers Past Grand Commanders: Greetings; **Be it hereby Ordered**, that for the purpose of this Grand Commandery year, 2015-2016, the Grand Commandery of Georgia shall remain organized into two Corps. The two Corps shall remain grouped into three Divisions each. The First Corp shall continue to contain Divisions One, Two and

Be it further Ordered, that the Grand Officer assigned to each Division will Maintain direct communications with the Grand Commander and the Grand Recorder's office with respect to each Commandery within his Division, as to ritual opening, tactics, armory, regalia, programs and any special needs or assistance. Visit each Commandery in their respective Division as often as needed but at least once during this Commandery year. Represent the Grand Commander when requested to do so.

Be it further Ordered, that the Grand Officer assigned to each Corps shall command, assist, and oversee his respective Division.

Be it further Ordered, that the Division Commanders shall conduct at least two (2) inspections in their Division and assist all other Grand Inspecting Officers so appointed by the Grand Commander in their respective Divisions.

GRAND LIAISON OFFICERS

Be it further Ordered, that one (or more as needed) Grand Liaison Officer(s) be appointed by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, from recommendations by the Division Commander, to assist the Grand Officers assigned to each division in the various duties assigned. Grand Liaison Officers report to and represent the Division Commander while on official business, and will be afforded the respect and honors due a Grand Commandery Officer.

Be it further Ordered, that Grand Liaison Officers shall be appointed to serve within their respective Division. The Grand Liaison Officers shall be expected to assist the Grand Commandery Officer assigned as their Division Commander in the duties of their office, relevant to that Division. The Grand Liaison Officers shall wear a red shoulder cord as recognition of their office.

INSPECTIONS All Commanderies shall be inspected by March 1, 2016.

Be it further Ordered that the Eminent Commander shall assemble the Sir Knights of his Commandery, on the assigned date, for the purpose of holding their annual inspection. The inspection shall be held in accordance with the Tactics and Customs of this Grand Jurisdiction. It is the duty and obligation of each Grand Inspecting Officer to be fair, objective and impartial in performing his work. The Eminent Commander shall see that each Sir Knight in the line be in full uniform at the inspection. The full uniform consists of a chapeau, white shirt, black tie, black coat, black trousers, black shoes, black socks, sword and belt. The wearing of this uniform symbolizes us as the Christian Soldiers within the Masonic Fraternity and we should each take personal pride in wearing it as a statement of who we are and what we represent.

Be it further Ordered, that each Recorder is directed to furnish the Grand Inspecting Officer with such information that will enable him to answer all questions on the inspection form. The completed inspection form is requested to be forwarded to the office of the Grand Recorder within ten (10) days after the inspection.

BONDS

Be it further Ordered, that the Grand Commandery Constitution, Statutes, and Regulations require that the Treasurer and Recorder of each Constituent Commandery be bonded, unless the Commandery By-laws require more than one signature on a voucher or check before any monies are disbursed. The Grand Inspecting Officer will verify if either method is in order. Written proof of the last audit, showing date audited, will be provided to the Grand Inspecting Officer.

CHARITIES

It is my hope that each Sir Knight within this Grand Jurisdiction shall continue to contribute to our charities as liberally as your ability permits. Let us continue our efforts to support the Grand Encampment's Knight Templar Eye Foundation Inc., and the Molly S. Moseley Eye Foundation Trust of Georgia Inc. I also encourage each Commandery to implement a program whereby funds will be set aside to sponsor a Minister on a trip to the Holy Land.
