ARTICLE I.	
Officers, Election of Officers, and the Time of Meeting.	
Section 1. The Officers shall be a High Priest. King, Scribe, Captain of the Host, Principal Sojourner, Royal Arch Captain, three Masters of Veils, a Treasurer, Secretary, Sentinel and Chaplain. The Office of Se Treasurer may be filled by the same person, if the Chapter so desires.	cretary and

Section 3. The annual election of officers shall be at the last regular Convocation preceding the end of the year, and shall be by ballot; and a majority of the votes cast shall be necessary for an election. ARTICLE II Application for the Degrees-Balloting, Etc.	
Section 1. Application for the degrees conferred in this Chapter must be made in writ candidate vouched for by two members. the Secretary and Treasurer, and report at the Convocation set apart for the annual election of officers. Previous to the election, unless otherwise ordered by the Chapter, said report shall be read and entered on the minutes.

Section 5. The Chapter shall be opened and closed in due form at each Convocation.

## ARTICLE III. Government and Fiscal Concerns.

Section 1. The High Priest, King, Scribe and Secretary, or any two of them, shall constitute a Committee of Charity in the recess between the regular Convocations, and have power to appropriate and draw on the Treasurer for any sums not exceeding \$ for that purpose.
Section 2. The fees for the degrees in this Chapter shall be \$ and must be paid in full before the Chapter degrees can be conferred.
Section 3. The Treasurer may be exempted from dues if the Chapter so votes. All other members, except such as are exempt under Grand Chapter Law, shall pay into the funds of the Chapter the sum of \$ per year as dues, payable on January 1 of each year, in advance. Should any member fail to pay his dues for two years, he may be suspended after due notice, without trial.
Section 4. The Sentinel may receive such amount as the Chapter may from time to time determine for his attendance at each Convocation of the Chapter. It shall be his duty to prepare the hall for the meetings, and at the close of the Convocation, to place all the furniture, jewels, etc., of a movable character, in such private place as the Chapter may provide therefore.
Section 5. The Secretary shall collect all moneys due the Chapter, keep proper entries of the same, pay them over to the Treasurer, and at all times have his books and vouchers ready for the inspection of the Chapter, for which he shall receive the sum of \$
ARTICLE IV.  Masonic Conduct, and Offenses.
Section 1. The Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Georgia and its subordinate Chapters will accept the discipline inflicted on Royal Arch Masons of this Jurisdiction by the Grand Lodge of Georgia under the provisions of its Penal Code as they now or hereafter read.
ARTICLE V. Amendments
Section 1. Any amendment or alteration to these By-Laws shall be proposed in writing, at a regular Convocation, and read and noted on the minutes. It shall then lie over until the next regular Convocation, when the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present and voting shall be required for its adoption.
