REPORT OF THE LONG-RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE

This has once again been a very productive year and I am pleased to summarize our efforts. Last year we sponsored legislation to reform our election procedures that was adopted by Grand Chapter and Grand Council. In accordance with the new procedures we developed a form for Grand Officer nominations that were sent by the Grand Secretary/Recorder in late October to the Secretaries and Recorders throughout the State. Those forms were returned to the Grand Secretary's Office and the Masonic Resumes of those applying to run for election will be sent to the local York Rite Bodies well in advance of our Grand Sessions. In efforts to assist all Grand York Rite Bodies to serve you, we developed Officers Training Manuals for all three bodies and those manuals were given to all prospective Grand Officers for the 2025-2026 York Rite year. We will be happy to share a digital version with any Grand York Rite member after a request has been received by the Chairman of this committee and approval granted by a majority of the committee members.

Finally, as all good organizations should have a Mission Statement to guide the Grand Officers as they perform their duties, the Long-Range Planning committee submits the following Mission Statement:

The Mission of the Grand York Rite Bodies of Georgia shall be to preserve and protect the Degrees and Orders of the York Rite, to contribute to the Masonic journey or its members. and to keep our members engaged and dedicated to their journey. I also want to thank III Companion Peter Bard for serving as the Assistant CMMRF Chairman and the rest of the CMMRF committee for their hard work this past year. Please refer to the CMMRF report for our final results for the year. Georgia did an outstanding job this year and I would like to thank all the Companions and Councils who contributed to CMMRF. It was all of you who made this year a success.

STATE OF THE CRAFT

As I traveled, I kept hearing a repeating theme. Companions talked about days of yore, when the chairs were full. Now many Councils struggle with attendance. If you see this is your area, ask your council to get together and visit them. My message this year is "Let Not Your Heart Be Troubled!" This Committee is charged with the responsibility of administering the funds of the Knights Templar Educational Foundation, Division of Georgia, and the funds of our solely owned Corporation, Knights Templar Educational Foundation of Georgia, Inc. and the funds of the Mollie S. Moseley Eye Foundation Trust of Georgia, Inc., as well as the investment accounts for the Grand Chapter of Georgia, RAM, Grand Chapter of Georgia Building, Grand Council of Georgia, R&SM, Grand Commandery of Georgia, KT.

The Division funds, which are controlled by rules and regulations of the Grand Encampment, allowed the committee to award five \$1000 scholarships to deserving students to further their education.

We are pleased to report the net worth of the following investment accounts effective December 31, 2024: KTEF, Division = \$365,178.74; KTEF, Inc. = \$5,063,913.79; MSM Trust = \$1,015,485.19; Grand Chapter = \$362,333.74; Grand Council = \$58,715.34; Grand Commandery = \$555,956.89; and Building Fund = \$104,815.22.

The Trustees will nominate, and submit for election, a replacement at the annual meeting on May 2, 2025. The Grand Liaison Officers will report to and represent the Grand Commander and or the Division Commander while on official business and will be afforded the respect and honors due a Grand Commandery Officer. Each Grand Liaison Officer will make one Official Visit to their Respective Commanderies in the Templar Year, assist the Division Commander in coordinating the Annual Inspections of their Respective Commanderies and attend the Grand Commandery Conclave. The Grand Liaison Officers shall wear a red and green shoulder cord as recognition of their office.

INSPECTIONS

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED: That all Commanderies shall be inspected by March 1, 2026. Each Eminent Commander shall assemble the Sir Knights of his Commandery, on a date and time selected by the Eminent Commander, for the purpose of participating in their Annual Tactics Inspection. This Inspection shall be held in accordance with the Tactics and Customs of this Grand Jurisdiction and shall include a full uniform Tactics Inspection by their assigned Grand Liaison Officer, serving as the Grand Inspecting Officer. The Eminent Commander shall see that each Sir Knight, in the line, is in full uniform in accordance with the Grand Commandery Code and the Grand Encampment Constitution. The uniform symbolizes us as the Christian Soldiers within the Masonic Fraternity and we should each take personal pride in wearing it as a statement of who we are and what we represent. The assigned Grand Liaison Officer shall submit to the Grand Recorder a full report of the Tactics Inspection within ten (10) days of said inspection using the 2025-26 Commandery Tactics Inspection Report form. All outdated Inspection Report forms will be rejected. The failure of a Commandery to not have the Tactical Inspection completed by March 1 of the calendar year, will receive an "Incomplete" Tactical Inspection Report. If a Commandery receives an "Incomplete" Tactical Inspection Report for two (2) consecutive years, that Commandery will be liable to the Grand Commandery of Georgia Code Article III. Section 13.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED: That each Eminent Commander shall assemble the Sir Knights of his Commandery, on the assigned Divisional Conclave Date and at the assigned time, for the purpose of participating in their respective Annual Divisional Conclave. The Divisional Conclave shall include a Tactics and Ritual School of Instruction facilitated by the appropriate Grand Commandery Custodians. Also at the Annual Divisional Conclave, each Recorder shall furnish their assigned Grand Inspecting Officer such information that will enable him to answer all questions on the Administrative Inspection Form. The completed Administrative Inspection Form shall then be forwarded to the Grand Recorder within ten (10) days after said Administrative Inspection. All assigned Grand Inspecting Officers MUST use the current Administrative Inspection Report form. All outdated Inspection Report forms will be rejected. The failure of a Commandery to not have the Administrative Inspection completed by March 1 of the calendar year, will receive an "Incomplete" Administrative Inspection Report. If a Commandery receives an "Incomplete" Administrative Inspection Report for two (2) consecutive years, that Commandery will be liable to the Grand Commandery of Georgia Code Article III, Section 13.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED: That as per the Grand Commandery Constitution, Statutes, and Regulations that the Treasurer and Recorder of each Constituent Commandery will be bonded, unless the Commandery By-laws require more than one signature on a voucher or check before any monies are disbursed. The Grand Inspecting Officer shall verify if either method is in order.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED: That written proof of the last audit, showing date audited and a copy of tax form 990 shall be provided to the Grand Inspecting Officer at the Divisional Conclave.

CHARITIES

It is my hope and prayer that each Sir Knight, within this Grand Jurisdiction, shall continue to contribute to our charities as liberally as his ability permits. 

Your committee on Charters, By-Laws and Dispensations wishes to make the following report:

Your Committee has received a rewrite of the bylaws of Toccoa Chapter No. 21. Your Committee recommends approval as submitted.

Your Committee has received a change in the bylaws of Pickens Chapter No. 28 changing the meeting dates to odd months during the year. Your Committee recommends approval as submitted.

Your Committee has received a rewrite of the bylaws of Newnan Chapter No. 34 changing meeting dates and dues and fees and other minor changes. Your Committee recommends approval as submitted.

Your Committee has received a change in the bylaws of Wilford H. Hall Chapter No. 80 changing the dues. Your Committee reluctantly recommends approval as submitted

Your Committee has received a complete revision of Ellijay Chapter No. 150. Your Committee recommends approval as submitted.

Your COMMITTEE AGAIN NOTES that PERHAPS Valdosta would be better served by being in the Second District with the cities of Tifton, Albany, Thomasville, etc. rather than being in the South Georgia Royal Arch Masonic Convention.

This committee has reviewed all dispensations issued by the Most Excellent Grand High Priest and they are of a routine nature and meet with our approval. Almost all were to receive and ballot at a regular convocation.

Your Committee notes with sadness that Pythagoras Chapter No. 10 at Griffin, Georgia was consolidated with Lakewood Chapter No. 27 at Lovejoy, Georgia on December 17, 2024. The chapter was 180 years old and I served as Grand High Priest as a member of that chapter way back when. Forest Park Chapter No. 75 at College Park consolidated with Fayette County Chapter No. 72 at Fayetteville also on December 17, 2024. (John and Ruben are sad too)

Your Committee was asked if a By-Law that states that a member is only eligible for elective office if he is in current dues status is proper. Your Committee asked the chapter to refer it to Jurisprudence, but I believe the amendment was withdrawn.

This Committee notes that dispensation No. 19 was issued on April 8, 2025 to form a new chapter in McCaysville, Georgia. Your committee has reviewed the

submitted documents and believes its future looks bright. Chapter will be under dispensation until 2026.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Elberton No. 25 175 years, J. M. Rushin No. 23, 125 years. It has been 50 years since Augusta chapter No. 2 was allowed by this Grand Chapter to change its number to No. 1.
