In Memoriam for WILLIAM JOHNSON "BILLY" BIRD December 20, 1928 – February 15, 2016

Most Excellent Companion William Johnson "Billy" Bird was born in Metter, Georgia on December 20, 1928. He died Monday, February 15, 2016. He was a member of First Baptist Church of Jesup and the Golden Ruler's Sunday School Class. He was predeceased by his parents, Claude and Ruby Bird and brother, Raymond Bird. Survivors are his wife of 62 years, Mary Godwin Bird of Jesup; daughter and son-in-law, DeLisa Bird-House and Ray House of Jesup; son, Dr. William Anthony Bird and wife, Dr. Beverly Bird of Roswell; brother and sister-inlaw, Claude and Cleora Bird of Baxley; several nieces, nephews, and cousins.

Most Excellent Companion Bird moved to South Georgia in 1941, spending his teen years in Glennville, Statesboro and Baxley. He graduated from high school in 1946 and enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He served aboard the U.S.S. Toledo. Most Excellent Companion Bird worked for Walker Chevrolet Company in Jesup, Georgia and received his technical training at the General Motors Center in Jacksonville, Florida. He was the Parts Manager at Walker Chevrolet upon retirement.

Most Excellent Companion Bird became a Member in Jesup Lodge No. 112 on June 9, 1956 and served as Worshipful Master in 1962. Companion Bird was exalted as a Royal Arch Mason in Jesup Chapter No. 70 and served as High Priest in 1961. He was greeted at Ballard Council No. 16 in 1957. Companion Bird was knighted in St. Elmo Commandery No. 21, Brunswick, Georgia in 1957. Master Mason was achieved June 8, 1956. He served in Masonic work over 50 years and held memberships in Scottish Rite and Alee Temple of Savannah. Companion Bird served as District Grand Deputy to the Grand High Priest of Georgia in 1991. He continued through the line of Officers becoming Grand High Priest in 1996. In 1991, he was awarded the General Grand Chapter Bronze Medal, an award for distinguished service.

Our Brother and Most Excellent Companion William Johnson "Billy" Bird, as we knew him, was a Masonic Giant. Known throughout the Masonic Kingdom as "Mr. Principle Sojourner," he traveled over the State many years doing his "part," probably better than anyone ever did or will do it in the future. He owned it! And he loved doing it!

Brother Billy was also a longtime member of the Ancient & Accepted Scottish Rite and attained the rank and decoration of Knight Commander Court of Honor. His funeral service was held February 18, 2016 at Jesup First Baptist Church with Dr. Mike Von Moss and Clyde Griffin officiating. Interment with full Masonic Rites was completed at Pinecrest Memorial Cemetery. Active pallbearers were Scott Godwin, Jeremy Godwin, Kody Godwin, Gary Bird, Glenn Jackson, and Ed Exley. Honorary pallbearers were members of Jesup Masonic Lodge 112, F&AM Jesup Chapter No. 70, Royal Arch Masons and all Free and Accepted Masons of Georgia, Shriners, Wayne Memorial ER Department and Administration, Jones Drug Coffee Group (The Liar's Club Members and Spouses), Michael Evans, Ralph Covington, and Dr. R. A. Pumpelly, IV and staff.

Our Friend and Brother and Most Excellent Companion Billy was a lover of the Fraternity and he enjoyed his many friends and Brothers. Billy touched the lives of many people with his exuberance, love of life and with a warm and caring heart. Billy lived life to the fullest and it was obvious everywhere he went. We will miss him.

In Memoriam for JAMES THEODORE "TERRY" FARMER September 29, 1939 – March 6, 2016

It becomes my sad duty to answer the roll for James Theodore Farmer, known to us as Terry, who can no longer answer for himself. It is our hope and belief that he has gone from among us to a better place, where there is no sickness and no sadness. Five Grand High Priests have died in office while serving this Grand Body, and Terry is now the third one from Pythagoras Chapter Number 10, in Griffin.

I first met Terry and his family at least 40 years ago when he and I were living on the same street in Hampton, Georgia and we have been friends ever since, traveling many miles together since 1995. Terry was born in Fayetteville, Cumberland County, North Carolina and was the only child of Ted and Sarah Farmer. They moved to Aberdeen N.C. in 1940 where his Dad was a conductor on the Aberdeen and Rockfish Railroad for 37 years. Terry graduated from Aberdeen High School in 1958. He Enlisted in the Air Force in September 1959 and was discharged in October of 1967. During his Air Force career he was stationed at Hamilton AFB Calif., Iraklion, Crete, Greece, Kessler AFB Miss., Seymour Johnson AFB N.C., and Phan Rang AFB Vietnam. Terry was an Air Traffic Controller and while in the Air Force attended NCO leadership school in 1965. He won a Speak-up award for public speaking. He was the Seymour Johnson Base Outstanding Airman of the Year in 1965. He Received the Air Force Commendation Medal for Meritorious Service while in Vietnam from January 24, 1966 – December 20, 1966.

Terry married Brenda J. Luck on December 4, 1959. They had 4 children, Greg, Dee, Buffi and Jamie, 7 Grandchildren and 2 Great Grandchildren. They were married a little over 55 years at Brenda's death, July 23, 2015. Terry worked for the FAA in ARTCC in Hampton Ga. and retired after 14 years of Government service due to medical reasons. Terry and his family were very active in Hampton Baptist Church and then Calvary Baptist in Hampton. After they moved to McDonough, they became very active in Bethany Baptist Church where he served as Santa for the preschool program for 10 years and director of the tape ministry for 15 years. He enjoyed singing and was a part of New Dawn Quartet and the Farmer Family Singing Group. What a blessing they were too many! It was in Freemasonry that Terry found his niche and became one of its most active members. He was raised in Hampton Lodge #70, Hampton, Ga. on February 26, 1993 and served as Worshipful Master in 1998. He served as Worshipful Master of the 6th District Masonic Convention in 2013 and affiliated with Golden Fleece Lodge #6 in Covington, Georgia as a dual member in 2012.

He became a member of the York Rite bodies in the York Rite – Shrine one day class in September of 1995 and often told the story that I gave him a petition and made him fill it out since I was Grand High Priest at the time and I wanted to make sure there was at least one candidate for the class. Terry served as High Priest of Hampton Chapter No. 54 in 2001 and High Priest of Pythagoras Chapter No. 10 in 2004. He served as High Priest 6th District RAM Convention in 2009 and as the Excellent President of the Order of High Priesthood in 2012. He was the Grand Representative to his beloved State of North Carolina. On May 5, 2015 he was installed as the Most Excellent Grand High Priest of The Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons, in the State of Georgia and served us well during his time in office and especially honored the Vietnam veteran members with his "Welcome Home Brother Pin." He served three terms as Illustrious Master of Griffin Council No. 8, the last being in 2005. He served as Illustrious Master of the 6th District R&SM Convention in 2006 and as the Thrice Illustrious Master of the Order of Silver Trowel in 2011. He became Eminent Commander of Griffin Commandery No. 35 in 2004 and later served as its Recorder. He received the Grand Encampment Membership Award and the Knight Templar Cross of Honor Award in 2010. He was currently serving as Knight Crusader of the South in the Knight Crusader of the Cross. In the Scottish Rite, he was likewise very active, receiving the Degrees in the Valley of Macon, November 12, 2002, serving as Venerable Master, Lodge of Perfection in 2007 and was invested with the rank and decoration of Knight Commander Court of Honour (KCCH) in 2007. He transferred to the Valley of Atlanta in 2011 and was a member of the South Side and the East Side Scottish Rite Associations.

Terry was invited to join many honorary invitational bodies and he served them with zeal: KYCH, Georgia Priory No. 39, 2005; transferred to Cherokee Rose Priory No. 56 in 2009 and was serving as Warder. Red Cross of Constantine, Alexander Conclave, 2008, currently serving as the Puissant Sovereign. Luther G. Palmer York Rite College No. 123, 2003, received the Order of the Purple Cross of York and Associate Regent in 2012 in Toronto, Canada and was currently serving as Governor of the College. Henry Troy Hooper Council #312 Allied Masonic Degrees, 2002, received Red Branch of Erie in 2004 and served as Sovereign Master in 2007. Carl F. Lester, Jr. Council No. 65, Knight Masons, 2003 and served as Excellent Chief in 2015. He also joined the Royal Order of Scotland in 2004. Terry became a noble of the Shrine at Yaarab Shrine Temple in Atlanta in the Summer Ceremonial in Helen, Georgia in June of 2013 and became a member of the Legion of Honor Shrine Unit in November of 2013. This is a uniformed unit of the Shrine which is composed of Shriners who have served or are still serving in the Armed Forces of our country. He was very proud to be a member of this unit and was currently serving as the First Lieutenant Commander. Terry will long be remembered for single-handedly organizing, planning and starting the York Rite Festival honoring the Grand Presiding Officers of the York Rite Bodies in Georgia in 2008. He has continued to organize and develop this annual Festival every year since and it has now grown to become the Grand Master and Grand York Rite Officers Festival. The funeral was attended by many Masons and he was buried in that narrow place of rest appointed for all at Bethany Baptist Church Cemetery in McDonough, Georgia. Greeted in Jason Burr Council #13 R&SM in Atlanta, Ga October 31, 1986, he served as Illustrious Master in 1992 and receive the Order of Silver Trowel the same year. He was elected and served as Most Illustrious Grand Master for the year 2005-2006. He was appointed and served as General Grand Sentinel of General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons International for the years 2005-2008. He was a member and Past Commander of Atlanta Commandery No.9 in 1996-1997. He was a member of Luther G. Palmer York Rite College #123 in Atlanta, serving as Governor in 2003-2004 and received the Order of the Purple Cross in 1997. He was a member of Atlanta Consistory of Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite since 1966, and served as Venerable Master of the lodge of Perfection in 1994. He received the KCCH on October 19, 1987, and was Coroneted a 33rd degree on November 25, 1985. He served as Director of Work from 1996 until his death. He was a member of the Scottish Rite Research Society; member of Cherokee Rose Priory #56 KYCH; member of St. Ambrose Conclave Red Cross of Constantine; served as Sovereign in 2010. He was a member of the Georgia Lodge of Research in Atlanta, Georgia. He was a member of the Royal Order of Scotland since 1990; Charter member of Zarathan Council #329 AMD and served as Sovereign Master in 1997 and received the Knight of Red Branch of ERI. He was a member of Georgia College SRCF; Charter member of Carl F. Lester Jr. Council #65; Knights Masons of the USA; Member Fidelitas Tabernacle #LXXVII KTP serving as Preceptor in 2013.

In Memoriam for JIMMY TERRELL PORTER September 20, 1943 – November 29, 2015

I rise to answer the call for one who has travelled to that undiscovered country from which no traveler has returned. Jimmy Terrell Porter has had the last veil parted and is now being bathed in that pure light of the Grand Architect of the Universe. Jimmy's soul came into this profane world on September 20, 1943 in Bartow, Florida. His parents were James William Porter and Myrtis Gibbs Porter; both of whom were from South Georgia. Jimmy's life was always centered around duty, honor, and service. These core beliefs would serve him well throughout his life. Jimmy began his service to God at an early age. This religious commitment was an integral part of his life. Ms. Glenda and Jimmy attended church wherever they lived all around the world. Locally, they were members of the 1st Baptist Church of Nashville, Georgia for over 20 years. Most recently, they attended "A New Way" Baptist Church where they felt a special presence of the Spirit of the Lord. Jimmy answered the call of his country by enlisting in the U. S. Air Force just after graduating from High School. He served with honor and integrity for 21 years. His last duty assignment was at Moody Air Force Base in Valdosta Georgia; where he served as squadron first sergeant. His next call to duty was from the Nashville, Georgia community. Here he served as Maintenance Superintendent for the Nashville Housing Authority. He oversaw and managed 325 apartments located in 9 different cities. He touched many lives and was a positive influence to all.

Jimmy began his Masonic journey by being raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason at Duncan Lodge #234 in Nashville, Georgia. He eagerly progressed through the chairs of this lodge, eventually becoming Worshipful Master. He was a charter member of Tift area Daylight Lodge #745 and also served a term as Worshipful Master. Jimmy recently affiliated with Tifton Lodge #47 and was an active member at the time of his death November 20, 2015. Jimmy loved working in the various vineyards of Freemasonry. He was active in both the Scottish and York Rites. Jimmy was a member of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, Valley of Albany. He participated in all of these bodies and was coroneted to the 33rd degree. For many years he served as the chief chef for the Valley and also was a member of the Scottish Rite Research Society. Jimmy served in a wide variety of other associated Masonic Bodies. He was a member of the Carl F. Lester Council #65, Knights Masons of Georgia. He was invited into Dixie Council #314 where he served as Sovereign Master. He also received the Order of Bath, the Order of the Cork, and the Order of Saint Patrick. Jimmy joined the Tall Cedars of Lebanon, Georgia Forest #181 Atlanta Georgia. He later became a charter member of the Tall Pines Forest #203 in Tifton Georgia and served as Grand Tall Cedar. He was a member of AlBan Grotto, MOVPER also served as Monarch. Hasan Shrine Temple AAONMS of Albany initiated him and put him to work as a "Keystone Cop." He was accepted into the Royal Order of Scotland, Provincial Grand Lodge, R.S.Y.C.S. and Provincial Grand Chapter, H.R.M. of K.L.W.N.G. of the United States of America. Jimmy was also very active in the Georgia Highlands Chapter, Royal Order of Scotland, serving as Prelate. Ms. Glenda and Jimmy were active in the Nashville Chapter #334, Order of the Eastern Star where he served as Worthy Patron. They also were members of Tifton Council #25 Order of the Amaranth serving as Royal Patron. Jimmy's tenure in the Grand Chapter of Georgia began in 2005 as Grand Master of the First Veil. He progressed through the line over the next nine years culminating with his election as Most Excellent Grand High Priest 2013. He loved each and every companion he served with and loved all of you as well. After his year as Grand High Priest Jimmy was chosen for one final duty. He

was appointed to be the Ambassador to Georgia for the General Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons, International.

Jimmy felt it was an honor to serve this great fraternity. But he knew that with this great honor came a serious responsibility. He responded to this challenge in the same manner as he had responded to those he had faced throughout his life. He called on the Grand Architect of the Universe for guidance and wisdom so that he might know what his duty was and how to fulfill it with honor, in order that he might humbly serve this fraternity. GRAND COUNCIL BILLS READ AND MOTION TO APPROVE BY MEPGHP JOE E TURNER

BILL No. <u>1</u> Approved

A BILL, to provide for an amendment of the Per Capita tax by amending Section 2.4.1, General Fees, paragraph 4. of the 2014 Grand Council Code of Georgia relating to assessment of Select Masters.

BE IT ENACTED by the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Georgia that Code Section 2.4.1, General Fees, paragraph 4, which currently states "For each Select Master whose name is on roll as of December 31, except those elsewhere excluded, \$16.00 plus any assessments levied by General Grand

Council" be amended to change the \$16.00 to \$21.00 and add a new sentence as follows:

An additional increase of \$1.00 per year shall automatically be added beginning in 2018 and continuing for five (5) years unless changed or amended by this Grand Council.

So that section 2.4.1, General Fees, Paragraph 4, of the 2014 Grand Council Code of Georgia as approved shall read as follows:

"For each Select Master whose name is on roll as of December 31, except those elsewhere excluded, \$21.00 plus any assessments levied by General Grand Council. An additional increase of \$1.00 per year shall automatically be added beginning in 2018 and continuing for five (5) years unless changed or amended by this Grand Council.

This Legislation to amend the Per Capita Tax if adopted, shall be effective beginning on January 1, 2017.

BILL NO. 2 Approved

A BILL, to amend the 2014 Royal and Select Masters Code of the Grand Council of Georgia by adding a new Section to provide for the establishment of York Rite Perpetual Memberships and a joint committee to supervise and operate the fund, which new section shall be numbered and worded as follows:

2.8.6.5 York Rite Perpetual Membership Fund of the Grand York Rite Bodies of Georgia: Provided similar action is approved by the Grand Chapter of Georgia, Royal Arch Masons and the Grand Commandery of Georgia, Knights Templar, this Grand Council does hereby authorize the creation and the joint operation of a Perpetual Membership Program under the name and style of the York Rite Perpetual Membership Fund of the Grand York Rite Bodies of Georgia. This Fund shall be administered by a joint committee of the said three Grand Bodies which committee shall be known as the Fund Committee.

The Illustrious Grand Master shall appoint one companion for a term of one year, another companion for two years, and another companion for three years who shall serve on the joint Fund Committee. Annually thereafter the incoming Illustrious Grand Master shall appoint one Companion for a three-year term. The Grand Recorder and the Grand Treasurer shall be ex-officio members of this Fund Committee. The Fund Committee shall make an annual report to this Grand Council. The joint Fund Committee shall be responsible for setting up the program of Perpetual Memberships, prescribing rules for determining eligibility costs, transfers, terminations and other matters; and shall also be responsible for investing the funds received and prescribing the amounts to be paid annually to each Chapter, Council and Commandery. The Fund Committee may alter, amend and/or revise its rules and regulations to maintain a sound program. Respectively submitted, Benjamin W. Polston, II, PIM (41)

BILL NO. <u>3 Approved</u>

A BILL, to provide for an amendment of how votes are determined by amending Section 2.1.4, Each Council Entitled to Three Votes; Section 2.1.4.1, Proxies, How Appointed, and Section 2.1.4.2, Past Grand Officer as a Representative of His Council, of the 2014 Grand Council Code of Georgia relating to votes. BE IT ENACTED by the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Georgia that Code Section 2.1.4, Each Council Entitled to Three Votes; Section 2.1.4.1, Proxies, How Appointed, and Section 2.1.4.2, Past Grand Officer as a Representative of His Council, which currently states: 2.1.4 Each Council Entitled to Three Votes-In the election of Officers, all votes shall be by ballot, or by acclamation if approved by a majority of those present, and each Council shall be entitled to cast three votes. In deciding the nature of the vote, it shall be as follows:

If only one delegate is present, then he casts the vote of the Council;
 If two delegates are present, then the delegate ranking highest in office shall cast the vote of the Council;

3. If all three delegates are present, a majority of them shall determine the vote. 2.1.4.1 Proxies, How Appointed: Should the Illustrious Master, Deputy Master, or Principal Conductor of Work, of any Council be unable to attend any Assembly of the Grand Council, either of them must appoint a Past Illustrious Master of his own Council as his proxy to represent him in the Grand Council. The certificate of appointment shall be in writing, signed by the Officer appointing him, and countersigned by the Recorder of his Council, under the seal of such Council. A proxy so appointed shall be entitled to the same privileges, and perform the same duties of the person appointing him, provided, that no proxy shall, under any circumstance outrank an actual officer of a constituent Council present; entitled to a seat in the Grand Council.

2.1.4.2 Past Grand Officer as a Representative of His Council— A Past Grand Officer, representing his Council, shall be entitled to his own and the votes of his Council (Governed by Section 2.1.4 above)

BE AMENDED to DELETE these three sections and ADD three new sections 2.4.1, Each Council Entitled to Three Votes; Section 2.1.4.1, Proxies, How Appointed and Section 2.1.4.2, Past Grand Officer as a Representative of His Council, so that sections 2.4.1, Each Chapter Entitled to Three Votes; Section 2.1.4.1, Proxies, How Appointed, and Section 2.1.4.2, Past Grand Officer as a Representative of His Council, of the 2014 Grand Council Code of Georgia as approved shall read as follows:

2.1.4 <u>Each Council Entitled to Three Votes</u>: Each Subordinate Council shall be entitled to three votes on all questions when represented in the Assemblies of this Grand Council by its Illustrious Master, Deputy Master and Principal Conductor of Work. If the three ranking elective officers are in attendance, each is entitled to one vote and cannot delegate his voting power to another. But the Representatives of a Council shall not vote upon any questions, when that Council or its conduct is before the Grand Council for action.

2.1.4.1 **Proxies**: If either the Illustrious Master, Deputy Master and Principal Conductor of Work or all of them be not present, and if through them or either of them, the Council is to be represented by Proxy, it shall be necessary for the Proxy to have a legal proxy from said officer or officers, duly signed, and the holding of said proxy shall disqualify the holder from the right to cast his own vote as a past Illustrious Master. A proxy of either of the above named Council Officers may be held by a Recorder or other member of the same Council who may not be a Past Illustrious Master, but he shall have no vote in his own name. 2.1.4.2 Past Grand Officer as a Representative of His Council— A Past Grand Officer, representing his Council, shall be entitled to his own vote only. A BILL, to provide for an amendment of the Starting Time by amending Section 2.1.1, Regular Assemblies of the 2014 Grand Council Code of Georgia relating to starting time of Grand Council.

BE IT ENACTED by the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Georgia

that Code Section 2.1.1, Regular Assemblies, which currently states 2.1.1 **Regular Assemblies**: The Grand Council shall meet annually in May in the City of Macon, Georgia, in the Grand Chapter Building. Beginning in 2015, the Opening of the Grand Chapter, Grand Council and Grand Commandery will be rotated among the three bodies. In 2015, the Grand Chapter will open at 8:30 AM on the First Monday in May, followed by the Grand Council and Grand Commandery at times to be determined. In 2016 the Grand Council will open at 8:30 AM on the First Monday in May, followed by the Grand Council will open at 8:30 AM on the First Monday in May, followed by the Grand Commandery and Grand Chapter at times to be determined. A BILL, to provide for District Grand Deputies and a State Chairman of District Grand Deputies by Adding a new Section 2.27, District Grand Deputies and State Chairman and sub-sections 2.27.1, 2.27.1.1 and 2.27.2, to the 2014 Grand Council Code of Georgia.

BE IT ENACTED by the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Georgia that Code Section 2. 27 District Grand Deputies and State Chairman and subsections 2.27.1, 2.27.1.1 and 2.27.2 be Added so that section 2.27, District Grand Deputies and State Chairman and its subsections of the 2014 Grand Council Code of Georgia as approved shall read as follows:

2.27 District Grand Deputies and State Chairman:

2.27.1 Appointment of District Grand Deputies: The Most Illustrious Grand Master may appoint District Grand Deputies who shall be a liaison between the Illustrious Grand Master and the subordinate Councils. There may be at least one District Deputy in each District and the total shall not exceed 22 Deputies. It shall be the duty of the District Grand Deputy, when called upon, to assist the District and local Councils in his District in planning programs and for degree work. It shall also be his duty to visit the Councils assigned to him in his District at least twice each year and review the condition of the Council and make a report on or before September 1 and April 1 of each year to the State Chairman of the District Deputies on forms furnished by the Grand Recorder.

2.27.1.1 Appointment of State Chairman of District Deputies: The

Most Illustrious Grand Master may appoint a State Chairman of the District Grand Deputies. He shall be a Past Illustrious Master who is well versed in the knowledge of the customs, laws, ritual and usages of Royal and Select Masters Masonry. He does not have to be, or have been, one of the District Grand Deputies. The State Chairman shall coordinate the activities and work of the District Grand Deputies, and perform such other duties as the Most Illustrious Grand Master may request. He shall report annually on the activities of the D.G. Deputies. 2.27.2 <u>Disposition of Reports</u>: When the visitations have been completed the reports shall be forwarded to the State Chairman of the District Grand Deputies. The State Chairman of the District Grand Master, the Deputy Grand Master, and Grand Principal Conductor of Work a copy.

A BILL, to provide for District Conventions by Adding a new Section 2.26, District Conventions and sub-sections 2.26.1, 2.26.2, 2.26.3, 2.26.4, 2.26.5, 2.26.6, 2.26.6.1, 2.26.6.2, 2.26.6.3, 2.26.7 and 2.26.8 to the 2014 Grand Council Code of Georgia. District Council Conventions have existed since at least 1954 with no provision for such.

BE IT ENACTED by the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Georgia that Code Section 2. 26 District Conventions and sub-sections 2.26.1, 2.26.2, 2.26.3, 2.26.4, 2.26.5, 2.26.6, 2.26.6.1, 2.26.6.2, 2.26.6.3 2.26.7 and 2.26.8 be added so that section 2.26, District Conventions and its subsections of the 2014 Grand Council Code of Georgia as approved shall read as follows: 2.26 District Conventions:

2.26.1 How Constituted: There shall be several Royal and Select Master Council Districts in the State in which there may be held annually, a Royal and Select Master Council Convention. These Districts shall be established or closed or merged with other districts as deemed appropriate by the MIGM.

2.26.2 Membership: All Councils in a respective District shall be members of that District Convention unless permitted by Grand Council, upon written request, to affiliate with another District Convention.

2.26.3 Officers: The officers of a District Convention shall be the same as those of a subordinate Council. They shall be first nominated and then elected in the manner prescribed by the By-Laws of the Convention. Eligibility to hold office in the Convention shall be determined by the Convention By-Laws.

2.26.4 By-Laws: The By-Laws governing Royal and Select Master Council District Conventions shall be subject to the same laws and provisions of the Code as are those of Subordinate Councils.

2.26.5 Sessions: Conventions may assemble as an ordinary deliberative body, or a Council may be opened by the duly qualified and regular officers of a local Council with which the Convention meets. At the close of the Convention, the Council should be closed by the Convention Officers or by the Officers of the local Council. The same precautions as to security from the presence of unauthorized persons should be exercised as by a Subordinate Council. While the work of any or all degrees may be exemplified by the Officers of the Convention, no actual candidate shall be greeted or advanced unless the regular Council has been duly opened therefor. In such event, if the sessions of the Convention be held elsewhere than at the Council room of the local Council, a special dispensation must be procured from the Illustrious Grand Master.

2.26.6 Functions of District Illustrious Masters, etc.:

2.26.6.1 Illustrious Masters: The Illustrious Master may provide for the exemplification of one or more degrees at such convention and shall:(A) Cause Masonic Instruction in the traditions and principles of the Order to be given to the craft on the occasion of the session of the Convention and provide the same for the craft of the District between sessions.

(B) Appoint Instructors in the Work when certified by the District Grand Deputy as proficient, and assign same, upon the request of the Illustrious Master of a Council, to such Council as may be in need of and find their services useful.
(C) Appoint a Committee on Program and Education. This Committee shall assist

the Illustrious Master and his Officers working in harmony with the District Grand Deputies, in providing the Councils of the District with Masonic Information and Education, and in helping to organize the Program when called upon.

(D) Assign Councils to each District Officer for visitations and if advisable, select and appoint other well versed Royal and Select Masters to assist.

(E) Secure the help of the District Deputy for Schools of Instruction and such other Programs as may be needed by the Councils and the Convention.

 (F) Secure the services of the Grand Council Officer nearest when needed.
 (G) Hold meetings of the District Officers at least two times each year between Convention Sessions to review the condition of the Councils in the District and all other matters of Royal and Select Masters Masonic Welfare and to devise plans and programs to promote the best interests of the Craft.

(H) Plan well in advance the District Convention, and include in the planning the Grand Council Officer nearest and the District Grand Deputy.

2.26.6.2 Line Officers: The Line Officers of the District Convention shall:

(A) Visit quarterly such Councils as are assigned to them.

(B) Make written report of the true condition of the Council to the District Illustrious Master.

(C) Arrange, with the consent of the District High Priest, for a school or Schools of Instruction as needed.

(D) Secure the help of the District Grand Deputies to the Illustrious Grand Master and the Committee on Program and Education in obtaining Masonic literature and assistance as needed in aiding the Councils in preparing programs promoting the purposes, traditions, and principles of Masonry, particularly Royal and Select Masters Masonry.

2.26.6.3 Constituent Council Officers and Members: The Illustrious Master, Officers and Members of the Councils in the District are requested to give close cooperation to the District Illustrious Master and those others herein provided and assigned for work in the quarry of Royal and Select Master Masonry. 2.26.7 Reports: It shall be the duty of the Illustrious Master of each District Convention to forward to the Illustrious Grand Master a report of the proceedings of Sessions held in his District and the condition of the Craft in such District. Following the meeting of the District Convention, the Recorder shall send to the

Grand Recorder as soon as possible, notification of the new District Officers and the date, time and location of the next Convention.

2.26.8 Balloting at District Conventions or York Rite Festivals: No petition shall be balloted upon at a District Convention or York Rite Festival. All candidates for the degrees conferred at District Conventions or York Rite Festivals shall be elected by their respective Council at a regular communication. Candidate's election must be attested to by the Recorder of his Council to the Recorder of the convention or festival.

Be it enacted by the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Georgia that **Section 2.2.1.4 –Committee on Finance** of the Royal and Select Masters Code, as it reads below, is repealed:

Section 2.2.1.4 – Committee on Finance. The Committee on Finance shall examine the books, accounts, and financial statements of the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder, and make such recommendations as may be pertinent in the premises. It shall also report upon all matters touching upon the finances of this Grand Council, and no appropriation shall be made without having been considered and reported upon by this committee.

and that the following section is enacted its stead:

Section 2.2.1.4 –Committee on Finance. The finance committee shall consist of three Companions appointed by the incoming Most Illustrious Grand Master, one of whom he shall designate as chairman of the committee. The chairman shall take care to notify all members of the committee of all meetings and two members of the committee shall constitute a quorum for the dispatch of business. The chairman shall take care to invite the Grand Secretary/Recorder, the Grand Treasurer, and the three dais officers of the Grand Council to all finance committee meetings. The finance committee shall meet at least quarterly to monitor actual income and expense, expended line items versus budgeted line items of the current year's budget and adjust actual or budgeted items accordingly. A BILL, to provide for an Auditing Committee by adding **Section 2.2.1.7 – Committee on Auditing** to the **Royal and Select Masters Code** of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Georgia.

Be it enacted by the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Georgia that Section 2.2.1.7 –Committee on Auditing be added to the Royal and Select Masters Code, so that when enacted the section shall read as below:

Section 2.2.1.7 –Committee on Auditing. The Most Illustrious Grand Master, at the time of his installation, shall appoint a Committee on Auditing consisting of three Companions of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Georgia. Prior to the next session of the Grand Council, the Committee on Auditing shall inspect the books of the Grand Council and review the actions of the Committee on Finance and issue a report at the next Grand Council as to the

appropriateness of all financial actions. No Grand Council officer, member of the Committee on Finance, or any staff or service provider shall serve as a member of the Committee on Auditing, but any of the same may address the Committee on Auditing and offer information as may be appropriate.

GRAND COMMANDERY BILLS READ AND MOTION TO APROVE BY REGC (HONORARY) JOE E. TURNER

BILL 1_Approved

A BILL, to provide for an amendment of the Per Capita tax by amending Article I, of the Constituent Commanderies Section 3, Returns and Dues Section of the 2014 Grand Commandery Code of Georgia relating to returns and dues. BE IT ENACTED by the Grand Commandery of the State of Georgia that Article I, of the Constituent Commanderies Section, Section 3, Returns and Dues, ITEM 1, which currently states:

"SECTION 3, RETURNS AND DUES. Every Constituent Commandery shall pay to the Grand Commandery by remittance to the Grand Recorder, the following fees for its members

1. \$20.00 for every Sir Knight who is a member of said Commandery on the last day of December

BE AMENDED to change the \$20.00 to \$26.00 and add "unless otherwise exempt" and add a new sentence as follows:

"An additional increase of \$1.00 per year shall automatically be added beginning in 2018 and continuing for five (5) years unless changed or amended by this Grand Commandery. So that section Article I, of the Constituent Commanderies Section 3, Returns and Dues, ITEM 1 Section of the 2014 Grand Commandery Code of Georgia as approved shall read as follows in its entirety:

SECTION 3, RETURNS AND DUES. Every Constituent Commandery shall pay to the Grand Commandery by remittance to the Grand Recorder, the following fees for its members

1. \$26.00 for every Sir Knight, unless otherwise exempt, who is a member of said Commandery on the last day of December. An additional increase of \$1.00 per year shall automatically be added beginning in 2018 and continuing for five (5) years unless changed or amended by this Grand Commandery.

This Fund shall be administered by a joint committee of the said three Grand Bodies which committee shall be known as the Fund Committee. The Right Eminent Grand Commander shall appoint one Sir Knight for a term of one year, another Sir Knight for two years, and another Sir Knight for three years who shall serve on the joint Fund Committee. Annually thereafter the incoming Right Eminent Grand Commander shall appoint one Sir Knight for a three-year term. The Grand Recorder and the Grand Treasurer shall be ex-officio members of this Fund Committee. The Fund Committee shall make an annual report to this Grand Commandery.

The joint Fund Committee shall be responsible for setting up the program of Perpetual Memberships, prescribing rules for determining eligibility costs, transfers, terminations, and other matters; and shall also be responsible for investing the funds received and prescribing the amounts to be paid annually to each Chapter, Council and Commandery.

The Fund Committee may alter, amend and/or revise its rules and regulations from time to time to maintain a sound program.

A written request by petitioners to the Commandery for such recommendation, must be presented at a regular Conclave, read and filed, and referred to a committee of not less than three for investigation and report at a subsequent Conclave of the Commandery before action on said request is taken by said Commandery, and shall lie over until the next regular Conclave. All members of the Commandery to which such petition is made shall be given at least five days' notice in writing by the Recorder as to the purpose of such petition and the particular Conclave at which is to be passed upon. The Recorder shall certify all action taken on such petition before it is presented to the Grand Commander. But in the event of refusal of the nearest Commandery to grant a recommendation, application may be made direct to the Grand Commandery, which has power to grant a Dispensation or Charter, without such recommendation. If the new Commandery is to be stationed in a city where there is more than one Commandery, two of them located is such city must recommend such petition, as provided for action by the Grand Commander in granting Dispensations. Or if, where two or more Commanderies elsewhere severally stationed have concurrent jurisdiction, the consent of the two must be obtained before a dispensation for a new Commandery can be granted. BE DELETED in its entirety and a new Section 2 be added, So that Article I, Section 2, New Commanderies, of the Constitution Statutes and Regulations of the 2014 Grand Commandery Code of Georgia as approved, shall read as follows: SECTION 2. New Commanderies. Charters or Dispensations may be granted for the establishment of new Commanderies on the petition of nine or more regular Knights Templar directed to the Grand Commandery. For every such Charter of Dispensation, the petitioners shall pay in advance one hundred dollars (\$100.00). No Commandery shall be constituted until it has provided itself with a suitable asylum with proper paraphernalia to do the work of a Commandery. No letters of Dispensation for instituting a new Commandery shall be issued by the Grand Commander, save upon the recommendation of the Commandery in the same territorial jurisdiction nearest the place of the new Commandery prayed for. The Recorder shall certify all action taken on such petition before it is presented to the Grand Commander. But in the event of refusal of the nearest Commandery to grant a recommendation, application may be made direct to the Grand Commandery, which has power to grant a Dispensation or Charter, without such recommendation. If the new Commandery is to be stationed in a city where there is more than one Commandery, two of them located is such city must recommend such petition, as provided for action by the Grand Commander in granting Dispensations. Or if, where two or more Commanderies elsewhere severally stationed have concurrent jurisdiction, the consent of the two must be obtained before a dispensation for a new Commandery can be granted.

The members of a Commandery under Dispensation continue to be members of the Commandery to which they belonged when the dispensation was granted. Any Petitioner for a Dispensation for a new Commandery may sever his connection with such new Commandery at any time before a Charter is granted by notice to the Grand Recorder, and the new Commandery, and his Certificate of Good Standing or Demit shall be returned; and his membership shall remain with his former Commandery.

Whenever the new Commandery is chartered and constituted, the members immediately become members of the new Commandery, and their membership in the former Commandery ceases without the necessity of obtaining a demit. Such member may signify their desire to hold dual membership and they will continue as dual members. The Recorder of the new Commandery shall notify the Recorder of the former Commandery to which the Sir Knight belonged of their intention to hold dual membership.

Section 150, 151, 152, Constitution, Statutes, Disciplinary Rules, Standing Resolutions, Ceremonies, Forms, and approved Decisions of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States of America Revised September 30, 2012) No Commandery shall be named for, nor may a Commandery change its name, to that of a living person or any person who has been deceased less than 3 years, nor a name held by an active Commandery of this Grand Jurisdiction.

It is provided further, that with the unanimous consent of all members present in an Annual Convocation, that a Member may introduce legislation in writing, to revise, amend or alter this By-Laws Section. BILL NO. 7 Approved

An Amendment to Proposed Bill to repeal Section 2.2.1.1–Committee on Finance of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Georgia as it currently exists and to enact a new Section 2.2.1.1–Committee on Finance in its stead. Be it enacted by the Grand Chapter that Section 2.2.1.1–Committee on Finance of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Georgia, as it reads below, is repealed:

Section 2.2.1.1 – Committee on Finance. The Committee on Finance shall consist of three members, who must prepare a full and complete report of the financial condition of the Grand Chapter, and must submit the same during the session and that the following section is enacted:

Section 2.2.1.1 –Committee on Finance. The committee on finance shall consist of three Companions appointed by the incoming Most Excellent Grand High Priest, one of whom he shall designate as Chairman of the committee. The chairman shall take care to notify all members of the committee of all meetings and two members of the committee shall constitute a quorum for the dispatch of business. The chairman shall take care to invite the Grand Secretary, the Grand Treasurer, and the three Dais Officers of the Grand Chapter to all committee on finance meetings. The committee on finance shall meet at least quarterly to monitor actual income and expense, expended line items versus budgeted line items, of the current year's budget. The committee on finance shall present a balanced budget proposal for the next year to be acted upon at the Grand Chapter Convocation.

Morris Parks and Paul Nealey, Illustrious Grand Chaplain and Illustrious Grand Sentinel, respectively.

NECROLOGY

We are all saddened by the loss of 175 Council Companions in our Jurisdiction this past year. Among the deceased are MI Past Grand Master: Wilford H. Hall. Those who remain will miss all of the departed companions. Our thoughts and prayers are with their families.

DISPENSATIONS

During the Council year, I issued numerous dispensations of a routine nature, all of which are on file in the Grand Recorder's Office and have been referred to the Jurisprudence Committee.

APPOINTMENTS

It was my privilege and honor to appoint as Grand Council Officers Illustrious Companions Morris Parks, Grand Chaplain; Paul Nealey, Grand Sentinel; and John Morrow, Grand Organist. All of these Companions are members of Summit Council # 19 in Ellijay. I also had the privilege of appointing District Deputies to the Grand Council, with Illustrious Companion James Tate serving as state chairman. I also was honored to appoint Illustrious Companion Sonny Head as Custodian of the South and Illustrious Companion Tim Ingram as Custodian of the North. I also appointed as Assistant Custodians Companions William Michael Jones. Joey Jackson, Tim Starling, Ryan Nealey, Michael Sampsell, Larry Bennett and Michael Sosebee. All of these Companions did a great job and their work was very enthusiastically received and appreciated. Also, it was with great pleasure I appointed a Public Relations Committee for the Grand Council. The same committee was appointed by the Grand Chapter and Grand Commandery to promote York Rite Masonry in Georgia. The committeemen were Companions Rick Hallwood, Chairman; Kevin Miller, James Watkins, Rusty Cordle, and Keith Taylor. They will be promoting ideas to educate existing and new members and present information to encourage our Blue Lodge Brethren to join the York Rite of Freemasonry. I am very grateful for the service rendered by all of these appointees.

CRYPTIC MASONS MEDICAL RESEARCH FOUNDATION Illustrious Companion James Bard is doing a tremendous job of promoting our most worthy charity-Cryptic Masons Medical Research Foundation or CMMRF. Last year Georgia's Grand Council went from twentieth place nationally in contributions to CMMRF to tenth place this year. CMMRF research under the direction of Dr. Keith Marsh is working hard to find cures and treatments for a wide range of diseases using adult stem cells. The clinical trials are producing very promising results. We need to continue working hard to promote and fund further research.

RECOMMENDATIONS

I recommend the continuation of the MIGM's program I had for this year--CMMRF---which, in addition to Cryptic Masons Medical Research Foundation, also stands for: Community involvement; Meaningful meetings; Membership increase and retention; Rest, refresh and refocus; and Financial. We need to have more projects to benefit our local communities. Not only is it Goodwill in action, it is also a good way to attract prospective new members. We need to have a short, meaningful program for each meeting, rather than eat, meet and go home. We continually need to add new members to our membership roster. We also need to find ways to keep our new members rather than have them stay a year or two and then get suspended for Non Payment of Dues. We have approximately thirty thousand plus masons in Georgia that do not belong to the York Rite. I recommend each Council actively solicit new members from your area Blue Lodges. We need to get some rest along our journey. The Great Light I use as the Rule and Guide for my faith and practice tells me we should keep the Sabbath holy. It would be nice to have some refreshing activities during the year like having a cookout and inviting family and friends. We constantly need to refocus our efforts to improve our local bodies. If you have a program that is working, share it with other Councils. We must be financially sound if we are to pay our upkeep (percapita, rent, insurance, heating and air conditioning, etc.) and maintain our charitable contributions. I also recommend each Council obtain and use the recently revised Council ritual book, which is available from the Grand Recorder's office at a cost of five dollars each. I believe being able to properly open and close a Council and confer good degree work will be a Great asset to any Council's wellbeing. I recommend the Grand Council Finance Committee continue to include the Dias officers in the budget process. I also believe it should continue to vigorously pursue ways to increase revenue without raising per-capita and to decrease expenses. I commend the driving force and hard work of Illustrious Companions Ben Polston, Dovle Hatfield and the rest of the Companions involved (Companions Paul Wells, Wade Smith, Bob Gill, Joe Turner, Terry Hensley, Jan Giddens, Terry Farmer, Lloyd Leinbaugh, John Haggas, William Shepard, and Mark Bradley) that resulted in a budget format that can finally be understood and will serve as a template for generations to come. I recommend further research into the possibility of installing an elevator in the Grand York Rite Building. I realize the building is on the list of historic buildings, but we need to find a better way to access the upstairs portion of the building so we can make better use of our building and make our meetings easily accessible to all of our members. I recommend the continuation of the Public Relations and Membership Revitalization Committees to positively promote York Rite Masonry in Georgia and better educate new and existing members. I recommend a two-fold dedicated effort to address the problem of Suspension for Non-Payment of Dues. First, we need to make personal contact with each member subject to suspension for NPD to find out what is wrong: are they having financial difficulties; are they not impressed enough with our Councils to want to remain a member; find out what would make them want to remain a member and pay their dues, etc. Secondly, we need to make a thorough effort to contact those members who were suspended for NPD and find out what it would take them to come back into the fold -maybe allow them to pay the current year and one year's back dues. It would be better to have some money and another member on our roster than to have no money at all.

STATE OF THE CRAFT

Although our Craft continues to suffer from decreasing membership, those Companions all over the state who are active in their local bodies are very much alive and well. Our deceased Most Excellent Grand High Priest Terry Farmer's idea of taking the schools of instruction to the area Councils has been a huge success. Some Councils are conferring their own work. Some are holding fund-raisers to help with their operating expenses and to support our charity, CMMRF. Enthusiasm for our York Rite Bodies is very high. With Very Illustrious Companion Benjamin W. Polston's ideas and leadership ability, combined with the enthusiasm, dedication and support of the Grand Council line officers and all of the Companions of our great state, the Grand Council of Georgia is poised for a tremendous year. Join me in prayer and support for their efforts.

REPORT OF CHARTERS/BY-LAWS/DISPENSATIONS COMMITTEE To the Most Illustrious Grand Master, Grand Officers, and Members of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of the State of Georgia: Your committee on Charters and By-Laws wishes to make the following Report: We note that Dispensations have been issued to several councils to change meeting times, dates, places of location, etc.: Adoniram No. 1 to move monthly from Wrightsboro Rd. to Wheeler Rd. in Augusta and then to move to Evans, Ga.; Washington No. 6 to cancel meeting that falls on a National Holiday; Euclid No. 33 to move to a new location in Sandy Springs. Smyrna No. 60 to change the name of the council to G. Everett Cox No. 60; N. T. Pirkle No. 65 to change meeting dates; Fort Benning No. 77 to change from monthly to guarterly meetings: Lithonia No. 76 to move monthly convocations from Lithonia Lodge No. 84 to the old E. A. Minor No. 603 lodge building. Your committee has received no By-law changes from these councils and have no knowledge of when the changes were voted on or whether they were adopted by the members. We therefore leave the approval of these items to the Grand Council. Your Committee approves the amendment to the bylaws of Hunter No. 20 to change the time of the meeting. Your Committee approves the amendment to the bylaws of Covington Council No. 41 adding an amount for the Treasurer. Your Committee notes that Blakely Council No. 39 in Blakely, was consolidated with George H. Fields No 38. Your Committee appreciates the acceptance of these members into George H, Fields Council. Companion John Allen wrote every member of the council to see if they wished to go to Bainbridge or if they wished to be demitted. This saved a lot of work for Companion and recorder Bruce Mann in Bainbridge. Your Committee has before it a complete revision of the bylaws of the Fifth District Council Convention. One of the major changes is charging per capita fee for each member, while the old bylaws provided for a flat fee per council. Your Committee suggests Article 5 Section 3C be changed from the word suspended to inactive member of the convention. Its members would still be able to attend the convention if they desired. If the council is suspended, then maybe the members can't attend? The Committee also wonders in Article 7 Section 4 and 5, if the same person is both...how much does the convention pay. The Committee is also aware that

these By-Laws were further changed at the convention held in March 2016, but the new changes have not been received by your Committee. Your Committee does approve the submitted By-Laws.

Your Committee has before it what appears to be a complete revision of the bylaws of the Eleventh District Council Convention which were approved in 2015, changing the name of the Convention to South Georgia Council Convention of Royal and Select Masters and making other changes. Your Committee approves these changes and feels that expanding the territory beyond the Eleventh District will possibly strengthen the Convention.


Your Committee has before it paperwork and proposed By-Laws praying for a Charter to issue forth for a Council in Moultrie. Georgia which has been operating under dispensation since March 4, 2015. These Companions further request that they be allowed to use the name and number fo the former council in Moultrie, Georgia, being Moultrie Council No 14, which was consolidated with Tifton Council No. 58 in 2001. The Grand Council Code of 2014 and the General Grand Council Code are both silent on this matter. This Committee believes that the same actions as prescribed by Grand Chapter and General Grand Chapter as indicated herein "The Grand Chapter Code 2.10.2.6 states that a chapter defunct for five years cannot be "Restored". The General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch masons, International, Code states after the lapse of one year from the time the chapter became defunct, the old charter or number may be restored only by action of the General Grand Chapter. (Article V, Sec 501.001)" should apply in this instance. This committee does not consider this action a restoration, but the creation of a new council with an old history. The committee recommends that if this Grand Council votes to allow tis Council to use the name and number of the former council, that a charter be issued showing Moultrie Council #14. Otherwise the committee recommends aa Charter be issued to these Companions and their successors, to be styled Moultrie Council No. 84 to be located in Moultrie, Colquitt County, Georgia. It will be necessary for the council to obtain a new seal as it will be improper to use the old seal with the old charter date. We wish them much success in their endeavors.

REPORT OF THE CRYPTIC MASONS MEDICAL RESEARCH FOUNDATION

Most Illustrious Grand Master, Officers, and Companions-Greetings, 2015 was a VERY good year for CMMRF donations in Georgia. At the Grand Session last year I noted that Georgia had dropped to 19th place in donations nationwide and issued a challenge to the Companions to get us into the top ten, Companions we succeeded!

Donations by year for the last five years 2011 2015 2012 2013 2014 \$3.029.00 \$2,286.00 \$3.590.00 \$3.385.00 \$6.858.50 As one can easily see in the last year we more than doubled our contributions to our charity. Companions this is outstanding work! We finished only \$200 behind the 9th place jurisdiction and I challenge you, once again, to redouble your effort to climb in the standings. While the goal of having all Councils at least at \$1.00/per member is still in effect, I want to challenge all Councils to increase their donations by at least \$0.50/member over last year. Thank you to those Councils for their outstanding work! It is my pleasure to report that the following Councils earned Extender Bars for their Plaques last year. Marietta 74, Minor C. Shadburn 49, It is also a pleasure to report that Companion (Dr.) Wallace Mays earned a lapel pin with 16 diamond chips! Each additional \$1,000.00 donation will earn another extender bar for the Council or another diamond for the individual. Please note that all donations are cumulative back to 1986. CMMRF donations fund cutting edge research at the Indiana Center for Vascular and Biologic Medicine, using adult Stem Cells harvested either from the adult's adipose (fat) tissue or their own bone morrow, not fetus cells. The Stem Cells are used to treat peripheral vascular disease, the heart - both coronary arterial disease and congestive heart failure. There is also pre-clinical research using adult stem cells for the treatment of diabetes and diabetic retinopathy. emphysema, aortic aneurism, burn healing, and delayed wound healing. Future research prospects are arthritis and erectile dysfunction. The new slogan for the CMMRF is HELP 4 ALL, which stands for: Heart-Eyes-Lungs-Pancreas 4 Aorta-Legs, Lingering Wound Healing. Companions, Thank you for permitting me to serve you this past year in this most important area and many thanks for the many donations to this important research. We will be trying different ideas in the upcoming year to not only retain members, but maybe get some of those members back we have lost. Let's put them to work doing what they enjoy doing. Let's get new members into the Rite and find out what they like to do. We have to make sure the "Christianity" part of the York Rite is alive and well. We would like to see joint events sponsored with some churches around the state, Secret Santa, Secret Bunny, Secret Turkey, etc., until it is no longer secret. We must let our light shine. We will attempt to sponsor more minister trips to the Holy Land. If we can peak the curiosity of those congregations, and take part in their social events, they may be more apt to ask "What does it take to become a part of your organization". As we answer that question, we should see a membership rise in all of our Masonic Bodies.

He has designed a self-adhesive, digital, high resolution, vinyl (Avery SuperCast) color, wall image, of the York Rite Degrees, including the Blue Lodge, which he hopes at some point to distribute to all lodges. This would of course require either private or public funding from some source. After much discussion and many emails, your E & H committee has approved the design and the symbols relating to the Degrees. This proposal has also been presented to the Grand Lodge Educational and Historical Commission for their guidance and approval at the appropriate time. LLOYD JOHN LEINBAUGH PERSONAL

Right Eminent Sir Knight Lloyd John Leinbaugh was born May 24, 1946, the first of four children born to John C. Leinbaugh and Amo L.(Treaster) Leinbaugh in Painesville, Ohio. He was educated in the Painesville/Bellevue Public School Systems and graduated from Bellevue Senior High School in 1965. He attended Cleveland Engineering Institute in Cleveland, Ohio. He was employed by the Norfolk & Western Rlwy/Norfolk Southern Corp. from January of 1967 until his retirement in June of 2006. He married the former Helen M. Goss on May 27, 1972; they moved to the Atlanta area in March of 2000 and are members of the Powder Springs First United Methodist Church. They are the proud parents of one daughter, Dawn M. (Leinbaugh) Courtney and two grandsons, Cooper and Grant. He is a member of Veterans of Foreign Wars Post No. 1238; American Legion Post No. 294; the Tin Can Sailors Association; the U.S. Navy Cruiser Sailors Association and the Association of Marksmen in the Nation Guard.

MILITARY

Lloyd enlisted in the U.S. Navy on February 6, 1967 as an Illustrator-Draftsman and was honorably discharged on November 2, 1970 after serving two tours in Vietnam. He re-enlisted in the U.S. Naval Reserve on July 23, 1983 at Toledo, Ohio as a Yeoman and was honorably discharged on July 22, 1989. On October15,1989 he enlisted in the Ohio Air National Guard with the 200th RED HORSE Squadron at Port Clinton, Ohio. His primary AFSC was that of a Heavy Equipment Operator with a secondary AFSC of Explosive Demolition Technician. He was also a member of the Barrier Arresting Team and the Marksmanship Team, and retired from the Air Force on May 1, 2004 after serving nearly a year in Afghanistan for Operation Enduring Freedom after 9/11. Lloyd was raised a Master Mason on May 30, 1988 in Bellevue Lodge No. 273, F. & A.M. at Bellevue, Ohio and served as Worshipful Master in 1993 and 1998. He affiliated with Springville Lodge No. 153 as a dual member on January 23, 2001 and James E. Sledge Daylight Lodge No. 742 as a plural member on May 14, 2013, and is currently serving as Junior Warden. He received the Scottish Rite Degrees in the Valley of Toledo, A.& A.S.R., N.J. on November 19-20, 1993, affiliated with the Valley of Atlanta, A.& A.S.R., S.J. on March 4, 2004 and was Coroneted a Thirty-Third (33°) Inspector General Honorary on October 19, 2013. He served as President of the Cobb County Scottish Rite Association in 2008. He received the degrees in the Royal of Scotland Order on August 2, 2003 and is a charter member of the Georgia Highlands Association. He was exalted in Bellevue Chapter No. 113, R.A.M. on May 4, 1993 and served as Excellent High Priest from 1996 to 1998. He affiliated with Cherokee Chapter No. 13 as a dual member on December 14, 2001 and served as Excellent High Priest in 2008, and affiliated with Austell Chapter No. 87 as a plural member on July 8, 2004 and served as Excellent High Priest in 2005, 2007 and 2011 and Excellent High Priest of the 7th District Chapter of Royal Arch Masons in 2014. He was greeted in Bellevue Council No. 82, R. & S. M. on April 20, 1993 and served as Illustrious Master in 1995 and 1998. He affiliated with Marietta Council No. 74 as a dual member on December 14, 2001 and served as Illustrious Master in 2006, and affiliated with Austell Council No. 47 as a plural member on July 8, 2004 and served as Illustrious Master in 2005, 2007 and 2011. He was knighted in Fremont Commandery No. 56, K.T. on February 16, 1994 and served as Eminent Commander in 1997 and 1999. He affiliated with Constantine Commandery No. 26 as a dual member on January 17, 2002 and served as Eminent Commander

in 2007 and serving as Recorder since 2008. He was awarded the Knights Templar Cross of Honor on May 4, 2008, and was elected to serve as the Eminent Grand Warder of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar, of the State of Georgia on May 7, 2008. He was knighted in Ohio Priory No. 18, Knights of the York Cross of Honour on November 7, 1998 in Chillicothe, Ohio. He affiliated with Cherokee Rose Priory No. 56 as a dual member on May 31, 2005 and invested with the rank and title of Knight York Grand Cross of Honour with one guadrant on September 29, 2015. He was ordained in Fidelitas Tabernacle No. LXXVII, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests on November 15, 2014. He received his Orders in Alexander Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine and Appendant Orders on July 11, 2009. He was installed in Oglethorpe Chapel No. 103, Ye Commemorative Order of St. Thomas of Acon on September 17, 2011 as a founding member. He was knighted in Luther G. Palmer York Rite College No. 123 on August 30, 2007. He was installed in Emerald Council No. 70, Knight Masons of Dublin, Ireland on May 7, 1994. He affiliated with Carl F. Lester, Jr. Council No. 65. Knight Masons of the U.S.A. as a dual member and served as Excellent Chief in 2014. He is currently serving as the Very Excellent Grand Sentinel of the Grand Council of Knight Masons of the U.S.A. He joined Firelands Council No. 94, Allied Masonic Degrees on November 30, 1995 and served as Sovereign Master in 1998, and affiliated with North Atlanta Council No. 313 as a dual member on March 12, 2003. He joined the Square and Compass Club at Dobbins Air Reserve Base on February 18, 2009 and served as Chairman in 2013. He was initiated in Fort McPherson Chapter No. 60, National Sojourners, Inc. on October 22, 2014 as an honorary member. He joined General Elijah Clark Post No. 60, Scottish American Military Society on August 5, 2015 as a founding member. He is a member of North Central Forest No. 179, Tall Cedars of Lebanon of North America. He affiliated with Georgia State Forest No. 181 as a dual member and served as Grand Tall Cedar in 2005, and served the Supreme Forest as a District Deputy STC/Supreme Director from 2008 to 2014. He was accepted in the Georgia Lodge of Research on September 29, 2006 and served as Master in 2015, and is a member of the Grand Council College of Rites of the U.S.A. He was received in Zenobia Temple, A.A.O.N.M.S. of Toledo on April 9, 1994, and affiliated with Yaarab Temple A.A.O.N.M.S. of Atlanta and is a member of the Knights of Mecca unit. He was initiated in E.O. Merry Chapter No. 13, Order of the Eastern Star at Bellevue, Ohio on April 28, 1995 and affiliated with Powder Springs Chapter No. 493 as a dual member on July 17, 2001 and served as Worthy Patron in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2014. He was initiated in Fidelity Court No. 6, Order of the Amaranth on April 1, 2005 as served as Royal Patron in 2009 and 2013, and served the Grand Court of Georgia as Grand Royal Patron in 2014.

The first conclave under the charter was held at the same place on the 4th day of June, A.D. 1910, A.O. 792, at which time the Commandery was constituted. Constantine Commandery has had three Past Grand Commanders; R.J. Hancock, 1921-1923; L.D. Holcombe, 1967-1968; and G.C. Rogers, 1969-1970.

REPORT OF THE CHARTERS AND BY-LAWS COMMITTEE

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Officers, and Members of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Georgia: Your committee on Charters, By-Laws, and Dispensations wishes to make the following Report: Your Committee notes that dispensations have been issued to several Commanderies to change meeting times, dates, places of location, etc.: Georgia No. 1 to move its monthly convocation from Wrightsboro Road to Wheeler Road in Augusta and then to move to Evans, Ga; St. Omar No. 2 to cancel any meeting that falls on a National Holiday; the election return of Godfrey de Bouillon filed in April of 2015 indicated they would be changing their meeting date in June 2015. Your Committee has received no By-Law changes from these Commanderies and have no knowledge of when the changes were voted on or whether they were adopted by the members. We therefore leave the approval of these items to the Grand Commandery. Your Committee approves the amendment to the bylaws of St. Bernard No. 25, adding an amount for the Treasurer. Your Committee approves the amendment to the bylaws of Bethlehem No. 30 to change the time of the meetings. Your Committee notes that Trinity No. 39 in Blakely, was consolidated with Crusader No. 17 on November 10, 2015. We appreciate the acceptance of these members into Crusader Commandery. Sir Knight John Allen wrote every member of the Commandery to see if they wished to go to Bainbridge or if they wished to be demitted. This saved a lot of work for Sir Knight and Recorder Bruce Mann in Bainbridge. This committee has before it paperwork and proposed By-Laws praying for a Charter to issue forth for a Commandery in Moultrie, Georgia which has been operating under Dispensation since March 4, 2015. These Sir Knights further request that they be allowed to use the name and number of the former Commandery in Moultrie, Ga, being Mt. Calvary No. 28, which was consolidated with Coastal Plain Commandery #42 in 2000. The 2004 Grand Commandery Code is silent on this manner. Section 172, of the Constitution of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States of America (Revised September 30, 2012) states "As to granting a charter with the previous number, numbers assigned to Commanderies indicate seniority and justly so. After a lapse of eight years or more, during which former members have been scattered or affiliated elsewhere, restorations of the old Charter and of the old Commandery Number would not seem to be proper or equitable procedure. (1995, p. 114 & 280, No. 33, Gordon, 1988 digest - 46)" This committee recommends that if this Grand Commandery votes to allow this Commandery to use the name and number of the former Commandery that a Charter be issued showing Mt. Calvary Commandery No. 28. Otherwise, the committee recommends a Charter be issued to these Companions and their successors, to be styled Mt. Calvary Commandery No. 46 to be located in Moultrie, Colquitt County, Georgia. It will be necessary for the Commandery to obtain a new seal as it will be improper to use the old seal with the old charter date. We wish them much success in their endeavors. Moseley Eye Foundation Trust of Georgia, Inc. The Division funds, which are controlled by the rules and regulations of the Grand Encampment allowed the Committee to award five (5) \$1000 scholarships to deserving students to further their education. The Corporation funds, controlled by the Trustees, permitted \$42,000 gifts each to Emory University and GRU, formerly Medical College of Georgia; and Ten (10) Ministerial gifts of \$1,500 each to deserving individuals pursuing a career in Gospel Ministry.

The Mollie S. Moseley Eye Foundation Trust of Georgia funds are invested with only the interest used and sent to the Knights Templar Eye Foundation. \$10,000 was sent this year to Grand Encampment allowing the purchase of another Golden Chalice. We are pleased to report that the Knights Templar Educational Foundation, Division of Georgia funds has a present net worth of \$259,999.17. The present net worth of our solely owned Corporation, Knights Templar Educational Foundation of Georgia, Inc. is \$3,559,383.81 and the Mollie S. Moseley Eye Foundation Trust of Georgia stands at \$562,565.63. Since the term, on the Committee, of REPGC James B. Phillips expires at this Grand Conclave, this Committee recommends that the Grand Commander nominate and that the Grand Commandery approve REPGC Phillips to succeed himself for a five-year term on the Committee, expiring in 2021. We wish to thank Dr. Julian Nussbaum for his expert advice and recommendations in giving to the two Schools of Ophthalmology; Emory University and GRU, formerly Medical College of Georgia. He has been a valuable source of information and we hope to continue to call upon him. Presentations of the monetary gifts were made at a luncheon hosted by the Committee on March 15, 2016. 

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED: That the Grand Commandery Constitution, Statutes, and Regulations require that the Treasurer and Recorder of each Constituent Commandery be bonded, unless the Commandery By-laws require more than one signature on a voucher or check before any monies are disbursed. The Grand Inspecting Officer will verify if either method is in order.

AUDIT

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED: That written proof of the last audit, showing date audited, will be provided to the Grand Inspecting Officer.

CHARITIES

It is with great regret that I must submit this address on behalf of Most Excellent Grand Companion Terry Farmer. This was his year, the final leg of this journey, a journey he very much enjoyed. I cannot hope to know what thoughts Terry would have recorded in this his final address. I can only guess by conversations we had over the years. They are the two Companions that spent the most time with our Most Excellent Grand High Priest this past Year.

MEGHP Terry Farmer was dedicated to improving the Craft. He was determined to leave Royal Arch Masonry in a better condition than he received it. To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Grand Officers, and Members of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Georgia: Your committee on Charters and By-Laws wishes to make the following report: Your Committee notes that Dispensations have been issued to several chapters to change meeting times, dates, places of location, etc.: Augusta No. 1 to move the monthly convocation from Wrightsboro Rd. to Wheeler Rd. in Augusta and then to move to Evans, Ga; Constantine No. 4 to cancel any meeting that falls on a National Holiday; Taylor No. 48 to change meeting dates; Mt. Moriah No. 63 to move monthly convocations from Lithonia Lodge No. 84 to the old E. A. Minor No. 603 lodge building; Fort Benning No. 73 to change from monthly to quarterly meetings and Mt. Horeb No. 155 to move to a new location in Sandy Springs. Your Committee has received no By-Law changes from these chapters and have

no knowledge of when the changes were voted on or whether they were adopted by the members. We therefore leave the approval of these items to the Grand Chapter. Your committee approves the amendment to the bylaws of J. M. Rushin No. 23, to change the time of the meetings. Your committee approves the amendment to the bylaws of Covington Chapter No. 71, R.A.M. adding an amount for the treasurer. Your Committee notes that Tri-City Chapter No. 90 at Alma was consolidated with Waycross Chapter No. 9 on June 3, 2015. Your Committee appreciates the acceptance of these members into Waycross. Your Committee notes that Blakely Chapter No. 44 in Blakely, was consolidated with Bainbridge No. 94 on November 10, 2015. Your Committee appreciates the acceptance of these members into Bainbridge No. 94. Companion John Allen wrote every member of the chapter to see if they wished to go to Bainbridge or if they wished to be demitted. This saved a lot of work for Companion and Secretary Bruce Mann in Bainbridge. Your Committee notes that Douglas Chapter No. 52 at Douglas was consolidated with Waycross Chapter No. 9 on November 10, 2015, Your Committee appreciates the acceptance of these Nine members into Waycross. Your Committee notes that the Charter of Daisy Chapter No. 82 in Adel, was surrendered on February 1, 2016. The members were all consolidated into Tifton or Valdosta depending on which was closer and whether they belonged to the council or Commandery in Tifton or Valdosta. Your Committee has before it a complete revision of the bylaws of the Fifth District Royal Arch Masonic Convention. One of the major changes is charging per capita fee for each member, while the old by-laws provided for a flat fee per chapter. Your Committee suggests Article 5 Section 3 C, be changed from the word suspended to inactive member of the convention. Its members would still be able to attend the convention if they desired. If the chapter is suspended, then maybe the members can't attend? The Committee also wonders in Article 7 Section 4 and 5, if the same person is both how much does the convention pay? The Committee is also aware that these By-Laws were further changed at the convention held in March 2016, but the new changes have not been received by your committee. Your committee does approve the submitted By-Laws. Your Committee also has before it a revision of the bylaws of the Sixth District Royal Arch Masonic Convention changing the manner in which dues are calculated for the chapter members. Your Committee approves this amendment. This committee has before it paperwork and proposed By-Laws praying for a Charter to issue forth for a Chapter in Moultrie, Georgia which has been operating under Dispensation since March 4, 2015. These Companions further request that they be allowed to use the name and number of the former chapter in Moultrie, Ga, being Moultrie Chapter #91, which was consolidated with Tifton Chapter #47 in 2001. The Grand Chapter Code, Section 2.10.2.6 states that a chapter defunct for five years cannot be "RESTORED". This committee does not consider this action a restoration, but the creation of a new chapter with an old history. The General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, International, code states "after the lapse of one year from the time the chapter became defunct, the old charter or number may be restored only by the action of the General Grand Chapter". (Article V. Sec 501.00) Your Committee believes this same authority devolves to this Grand Chapter. The committee recommends that if this Grand Chapter votes to allow this Chapter to use the name and number of the former chapter that a charter be issued to these Companions and their successors, to be styled MOULTRIE CHAPTER NO. 167 to be located in Moultrie. Colquitt County. Georgia. It will be necessary for the chapter to obtain a new seal as it will be

improper to use the old seal with the old charter date. We wish them much success in their endeavors.
