Gary Leazer conducted services for this occasion and the following Grand Officers and Past Grand Officers were remembered as follows:

#### WILLIE PERSHING HAMMOND

Born April 17, 1919 Died September 1, 2011 Who since February 3, 1955 served the Craft of Freemasonry with distinction. He served all Masonic bodies, his community, state and country exceeding well, and in so doing, made a lasting and indelible impression upon our lives. He gave willingly of himself for the betterment of our fraternity; often going far and above what might be expected to perform what he perceived to be his responsibility; traveling thousands upon thousands of miles across Georgia; maintaining and exemplifying our ritualistic work. When Companion Willie called and asked for assistance in conferring Degrees and Orders, it was always an enjoyable experience. On those special trips there were some notable companions making the journeys as well; Sheffield Thompson, Lee Holcomb, Joe Suttles, Luther Palmer, Jim Moseley and Rufus White to mention just a few, and of course, there were many others over the years. Willie wasn't afraid of leadership but preferred being out of the spotlight. In either event, he was a genuine person in all respects. We are privileged to have been blessed by his friendship and his untiring devotion in serving Freemasonry and the York Rite in particular.

Companion Hammond was born on April 17, 1919 in Fairburn, Georgia, the son of Levi Ballard and Vinnie Hancock Hammond. At a very young age the family moved to College Park, Georgia where he attended the public schools.

He served in the United States Army during World War II mostly in Germany. He was employed by the Ford Motor Company in Hapeville and retired in October of 1978 after 31 years of service.

He was married to the former Lillian Crummey of Baxley, Georgia and in this union they were blessed with two daughters, Janet Reed and Debra Allen; and two grandchildren, Kimberly and Marc. Willie and Lillian enjoyed 65 years together!

Companion Hammond was of the Baptist faith and was a Christian gentleman in every respect.

His Masonic life began in College Park Lodge No. 454, College Park, Georgia where he was Initiated as an Entered Apprentice Mason on November 15, 1954, Passed to the Degree of Fellowcraft on January 10, 1955, and Raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on February 3, 1955. He immediately began serving as an appointive officer and was elected and served as Worshipful Master in 1964. He served as Grand Marshal of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Georgia, Free and Accepted Masons in 1987 during the term of his son-in-law, Most Worshipful Brother Dannie L. Reed. In 1987 Companion Hammond was the recipient of the Grand Lodge of Georgia Distinguished Service Award. Companion Hammond was exalted to the Most Sublime Degree of Royal Arch Mason in Forest Park Chapter No. 75 on May 19, 1956. He then helped to organize and became a charter member of Fayetteville Chapter No. 72 in 1968, serving as High Priest in 1969. He later affiliated with Pythagoras Chapter No. 10 in Griffin. He served as High Priest of the Sixth District Royal Arch Convention. He served as Excellent President of Georgia Council Order of High Priesthood of the State of Georgia. In 1983 Companion Hammond received the General Grand Chapter Distinguished Service Award.

Companion Hammond was Greeted as a Royal and Select Master in Hapeville Council No. 23 on July 10, 1956 and served as Illustrious Master in 1974. He received the Order of the Silver Trowel in 1974. He served as Thrice Illustrious Master of Georgia Council of the Order of the Silver Trowel in 1979. Companion Hammond later affiliated with Griffin Council No. 8. In 1988 Companion Hammond received the General Grand Council

Distinguished Service Award. In 1994 he was elected and served as Most Illustrious Grand Master of the Grand Council of Georgia, Royal and Select Masters. Companion Hammond was knighted in Griffin Commandery No. 35 on August 7, 1969. He served as Eminent Commander in 1971-72. He was elected to the Grand Line as Grand Warder on May 9, 1974 in Columbus, Georgia at the 113th Annual Conclave. He was installed as Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Georgia on May 13, 1982 in Augusta, Georgia. Sir Knight Hammond was a recipient of the Knight Commander of the Temple designation by Grand Encampment of the U. S. A.

Companion Hammond was a member of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, Valley of Macon, Georgia. For his service to Masonry he received the Rank and Decoration of Knight Commander of the Court of Honour. He was a charter member of College Park Chapter No. 473, Order of the Eastern Star and served as Worthy Patron in 1961-62. He was also a member of the Royal Order of Scotland; the Red Cross of Constantine; and Knight Crusaders of the Cross.

Companion and Sir Knight Hammond was a member of Georgia Priory No. 39, Knights of the York Cross of Honour and served as Eminent Prior in 1983. He was also a member of Upper Room Tabernacle No. XLV, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests. Companion Hammond served several years as the Grand Custodian for the Grand Chapter of Georgia, Royal Arch Masons and did an outstanding job in directing the ritualistic work across the entire state, North to South, West to East! Our Brother, Companion, and Sir Knight Willie departed this life on September 1, 2011 at the age of 92 to be with his Lord and Savior. His work on Earth having been accomplished, he has been released from his captivity in the flesh to return over the rough and rugged way of the valley of the shadow of death, to his abiding place eternal in the heavens.

"While these mortal eyes shall see him not again; yet by a firm faith and steadfast trust in the Supreme High Priest, we hope to clasp once more his vanished hand in love and friendship."

Many times we laughed together as we shared stories about each other and others, mostly about others. We shall miss his jovial attitude and his light-hearted wit.

Fermor was born January 14, 1919 in Milledgeville, Georgia, the son of the late Fermor R. Hargrove, Sr., who served as Illustrious Grand Master in 1958, and Ann Marie Moran Hargrove. He received his education at Georgia Military Prep School and Georgia Military College in Milledgeville, Georgia. He married Mattie Beall Butts on July 19, 1941, a union that lasted 60 years. To them were born two children, Sue (Mrs. Garnett Nash) and Wally Hargrove. Fermor and family were members of First United Methodist Church of Milledgeville and he served as member of the Administrative Council. He was a member and Past Puissant Sovereign of Oglethorpe Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine; member of Al Sihah Shrine Temple, Macon, Georgia; member of The Royal Order of Scotland; and a member of the Governing Board of Masonic Property representing Georgia Council No. 4, serving as life member of Board of Trustees of Masonic Property in Milledgeville.

Our Brother, Companion and Sir Knight Fermor Robinson Hargrove, Jr. was laid to rest on April 10, 2012 at Memory Hill Cemetery with full Masonic Rites. Survivors include his son Wally Hargrove (Melody) of Lawrenceville, a brother Billy Hargrove and a sister Marie H. Morgan both of Milledgeville, four grandchildren: Scott Hargrove, Tyler Hargrove (Caitie), Jeff Nash (Stephanie), and Kelly Vaughn (Donnie), eight great grandchildren and one great great-grandson and a number of nieces and nephews. It is with great sadness that I rise to answer the roll for Jeff Wilson Hodges Jr. A Master Mason in good standing and a member of Gate City Lodge # 2 where he was an active member since 1970.

Jeff was born in Fairland, Texas "the hill country in the heart of Texas" as he called it in 1924. Schooling was in an old one room school building. Soon after his family moved to Giddings, Texas where he started school in the fourth grade, and graduated in 1941.

Jeff was attending North Texas Agricultural College in Arlington, Texas when the famed attack on Pearl Harbor swept him into military service where he served in several units of the signal Corps, in the Pentagon, and served in Manila during the occupation of Japan. Jeff was honorably discharged in 1946.

Jeff's Masonic career is very extensive. With his low southern speech and demeanor he served on degree teams and would travel all across Georgia to assist in the ritual degree work. For years he was on the Scottish Rite 33rd degree team and was Coroneted Inspector General Honorary for the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite. A White Hat Mason indeed.

Jeff was raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason in J.D. Giddings Lodge no. 280 Giddings, Texas October 4, 1946. A demit was issued and a petition was granted to affiliate with Gate City Lodge # 2 in 1970. Jeff served as Master of Gate City Lodge # 2 in 1979.

Jeff Served as High Priest in Mt. Zion Chapter # 16 Royal Arch Masons in 1984. Jeff served as Illustrious Master in Jason Burr Council #13 in 1998. He served as Eminent Commander of Atlanta Commandery # 9 in 1999. At the One Hundred Fortieth Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery of Georgia Jeff W. Hodges was elected Eminent Grand Warder of the Grand Commandery of Georgia Knights Templar.

Many times during the years that we served together, Jeff would often talk to me about the Grand Commandery Line and what it meant to him. He would say that this is all I have ever wanted, to serve as Right Eminent Grand Commander. It is the honor that I had always hoped to receive but thought that I never would. Jeff Wilson Hodges was granted his wish at the One Hundred Forty Eighth Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery of Georgia and was elected Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Georgia Knights Templar.

Jeff W. Hodges leaves a long and laborious resume, not only in his Masonic Life but in his personal life also. He loved Lady Dorothy Chumley, and would work tireless pleasing her. Her Illness did not deter Jeff form his duty, as a man and caregiver. Lady Dot was the heart of his life, she came first. Sometime it is difficult to balance personal duties and responsibilities with Masonic responsibilities but Sir Knight Jeff made sure his devotion to Lady Dot and to the fraternity was balanced accordingly. Lady Nora and I traveled with Lady Dot and Jeff many thousands of miles over and beyond the state of Georgia. We saw the real Lady Dot and the real Jeff W. Hodges up close and personal. It was our pleasure to share a special part of our life with them. It was on one of these trips to Washington D.C. that we had the last conversation with the late Grady T. Bozeman, one of Jeff's greatest Masonic hero's.

Jeff W. Hodges believed as all Masons believe that after the strong hand of death has leveled all in the humiliation of the grave, the almighty hand of the Supreme Master shall prevail and exalt every Brother to that glorious companionship of that undissolving lodge. There the designs on the trestle board will be seen completed, there the adoration of the twelfth hour will be everlasting joy, there the noon tide bliss will eternally shine and there, the scales of doubt and darkness will fall from his eyes and the Divine Plans of the Supreme Master will be displayed in all their splendor. Sir Knight Jeff has faithfully borne the Cross with his honor unsullied.

When the ancient Knights went to their eternal home they bequeathed their armor, sword and shield to another, one who would carry out their quest unblemished and victorious. Today I symbolically lay down the sword, the working tool of a true Soldier of the Cross to honor Right Eminent Sir Knight and Past Grand Commander Jeff W. Hodges Jr. May his legacy long linger among us and future Knights Templar to remind us of the Grand Characteristic of the Order, unsullied honor, unwearied zeal in a brothers cause and universal benevolence.

Sir Knight Jeff's earthly remains are back in Texas as he wished; His spirit stands beside the Great Captain of our Salvation, Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

The touch of love is an appropriate topic as we have a memorial service for those Brothers, Companions and Sir Knights who have laid down their working tools during the past 12 months. Funerals and memorial services are held to remember loved ones who have died, but mostly they are held for those left behind.

In times of sadness, illness, or loss, we can reach out and touch people in love through physical love. In Jesus' day, lepers were considered physically, socially and religiously unclean. Lepers had to wear torn clothes, leave their hair uncombed, cover the lower part of their faces and call out, "Unclean! Unclean!" The leper in this story asked Jesus to make him clean so he might return to society and no longer be considered an outcast. Most of us do not know any lepers personally. But there are many with whom we meet every day who desperately need the human touch of love.

The June 1994 issue of the Mayo Clinic Health Letter noted the importance of the power to touch; it is the first of our senses to develop. Pediatricians noticed that babies in orphanages and hospitals who were not held and cuddled failed to grow and often died. Studies of long-term nursing home residents showed that those who were frequently touched when given their medications or had visitors who perhaps held their hands

demonstrated a more positive attitude about themselves. We can reach out and touch someone's life for the better through physical touch.

We can extend a loving touch through the words we speak.

We can touch people's lives through the affirming, uplifting, encouraging words we speak. Of the centurion, Jesus complemented him for his faith which I have to believe was just what the man needed to hear.

At Gwinnett Daylight Lodge No. 744, we were asked to pray for the wife of Wor. Bro. John Callahan who was soon having surgery. One of the Brothers present, Wor. Bro. Will Woodard, a Mason for 67 years, told us he was going to sit with Brother John while his wife had her surgery.

That's what I mean about a loving touch through the words we speak. Now some of you might say, "I wouldn't know what to say." You don't have to say anything profound; you can just sit quietly beside the worried Brother. It is called the ministry of silence.

We can touch people's lives by the loving words we speak and our presence.

We can touch people through love by the way we listen.

Albert Schweitzer said, "Open your eyes and seek another human being in need of a little time, a little friendliness, a little company, a little work. It may be a lonely, an embittered, a sick, or someone who has just lost a loved one for whom you can do something, to whom you can mean something."

#### REPORT OF THE FOREIGN CORRESPONDENT

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, King, Scribe, Officers, and Companions of the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons for The State of Georgia:

Your Foreign Correspondent has received and reviewed the Annual Proceedings of numerous Grand Chapters. Many of these are in CD format, and more jurisdictions have their proceedings available on their website.

As you may know, in our world today, more people are connecting digitally via websites and e-mail; and Brother Masons are even forming "Facebook Lodges." Our more formal written Masonic records will probably be read by historians for many generations. However, the written word is no substitute for our meeting and greeting as York Rite Companions, on the level in our chapter meetings. We must meet as Companions within our Chapters to keep our Ancient Craft alive. Further, there is in fact significant benefit in the exchange of Grand Chapter Representatives between jurisdictions nationally, as well as internationally.

Our Grand Chapter has been represented by a number of distinguished companions across the globe (e.g., PGM F. Ray Jackson to Nova Scotia, Canada, etc.). Service as a Grand Chapter Representative is not a popularity contest or reward for past service; it is serious business and requires serious consideration. This service benefits the Companion and the Grand Chapter in proportion with the initiative and effort invested. With our shrinking globe, we must maintain communications with our sister jurisdictions. The "Master's Wages" earned by the Grand Representatives benefit both the Companions participating as well as our Grand Chapter, and is central in the design of freemasonry to assure we maintain communication within our brotherhood.

While there does seems to be a resurgence of interest in the York Rite, nationally and internationally, to conserve our ranks, we must each be members of the Membership Committee of our Chapters. # **REPORT OF CHARTERS & BY-LAWS COMMITTEE**

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Grand Officers, and Members of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Georgia:

Your committee on Charters and By-Laws wishes to make the following report:

We recommend the approval of the complete revision of the By-Laws of Winder Chapter No.84, R. A. M. which also includes a change in the meeting place from Winder, Georgia, to Auburn, Georgia. The Grand Chapter has issued dispensation #8 dated February 21, 2012 for the Chapter to begin meeting there. Your Committee requests approval of the move by Grand Chapter as required by the Code.

We recommend the approval of the amendment of the By-Laws of Fort Benning Chapter No. 73, R. A. M., changing the time of the meeting.

We recommend the approval of the amendment of the By-Laws of Cartersville Chapter No. 144, R. A. M., changing the meeting day from Tuesday to Wednesday because of area lodge conflicts.

We were recently presented with a change in the By Laws of Cherokee Chapter No. 13 changing their dues. The admendment was not in proper form, having neither a first or second reading date and date of adoption, and the committee returned it for correction.

We have before us a change in the By-Laws of Genesis Chapter No. 166 to add an additional duty to the Secretary. The Amendment says "He shall ensure that the **ensuing** year dues notices are mailed to the membership not later than 10 February each year." The By-Laws of Genesis Chapter in ARTICLE V Section 3, provide that the dues to the chapter are payable annually in advance on or before the first day of January of each year. Your Committee does not feel it would be neither reasonable, nor prudent to require the secretary to send out dues notices for the **following** year by February 10 and is unable to approve this amendment. Your Committee would be agreeable to a revised amendment changing the month to September, October, November or December, such as the Chapter may agree on.

Your committee has received a change in the By-Laws of Alleghaney Chapter No. 64. changing the dues. Your Committee will approve the suggested dues. However, the second sentence of the new change that reads "Any member in arrears for 24 consecutive months shall be dropped from the roll of membership in the Chapter" is in conflict with Section 2.10.5.2 of the 1995 Grand Chapter Code which prescribes how a

companion shall be suspended. The committee is unable to approve this sentence of the new change. Please delete it or rewrite it to conform with the code.

Your Committee calls to the attention of the Grand Chapter that Columbian chapter No.136 in Washington, Georgia, with a membership of 55, has filed no returns nor paid any per capita tax in several years and has not met in several years. We leave this matter for your attention and direction.

This committee has received no requests for new chapter charters.

I would like to thank MEGHP William L. (Bill) Montgomery for appointing me as chairman of this committee and giving me the opportunity to work with such hard working and devoted companions as EGPS James Terry Farmer, EGRAC William F. (Bill) Shepard, EGMSV Troy S. Cook, and Companion William (Mac) McDaniel's. These companions have done an excellent job throughout the state in spreading the news of the General Grand Chapters search for the best place for our charitable contributions. At end of 2011 Georgia stood sixth in the nation with a total of \$384,941 in contributions.

The General Grand Chapter Royal Arch International will distribute contributions in a different form than in previous years giving more opportunity for research.

Dr. Frank E. Musiek, PhD, CCC-A Director of Auditory Research, Professor of Audiology, was given a \$60,000 grant at The University of Connecticut for his research on CAPD.

Autism Speaks, also located in New York City, and was given \$100,000 to work specifically on a program that focuses on children 12 to 36 months of age and testing for both Autism and CAPD.

#### REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Officers and Companions of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Georgia.

A meeting of the Trustees was held on May 7, 2012. The visible inspection indicated building was found to be in good condition, WITH A FEW EXCEPTIONS.

A new sound system has been installed in the Auditorium. Our thanks go to Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Bill Montgomery, for his generous donation. We have received bids from GEORGIA ELEVATOR COMPANY to install an elevator on the outside of the building below the New Street entrance. Since this is a long term project, we will continue fund raising. We have called Conditioned Air several times this year to repair the Air Conditioner. THE FIRST TIME; THE EQUIPMENT ROOM was full of water and the technician removed approximately thirty pounds of rust flakes and welded several holes. THE SECOND TIME; some leaks were repaired on the outside Compressor and an enormous amount of Freon was required. The technician stated that this old unit may have to be replaced within the next year or two.

We have had to repair most of the flushing systems and water supply valves during this year. All of the windows on the lower level are being secured with a locking system. This is a very high priority. It is recommended, that the Building Maintenance account and the RAM General Account be separated. The wooden doors on the front of the building that were replaced with new wooden doors in 1996 will need to be replaced. Since those doors take the brunt of the weather, in the long run, metal doors will save us money. I wish to thank Most Excellent Companion Wade C. Smith for his assistance in keeping the Trustees updated. Special thanks are extended to our building custodians for keeping our building safe and in the best condition.

We wish to thank Mrs. Ericka Matheny for the superb job she is doing. Even when I try to hide, she can find where I am when she needs me. You are doing a tremendous job Mrs. Matheny and we thank you.

#### Most Illustrious Grand Master 2011-2012 PERSONAL HISTORY

Harry B. Allen was born October 1, 1943 in Rydal, Bartow County, Georgia. He attended and graduated from Pine Log High School in 1961. Upon graduating, he served his country in the United States Army from 1962 to 1965. He had assignments in both Japan and Germany during his tour of duty.

After serving in the Army, Companion Allen went to work for Lockheed Corp in Marietta in August 1965 and retired in 2006. He also enjoyed working for the Atlanta Braves as a stadium usher for 10 years.

In September of 1965, he married Alice Arlene Lorren and unto this union a child was born in 1968: Carrie Janell Allen. Sadly, Mrs. Allen died in October of 1969 at the age of 23, from injuries in an automobile accident.

Brother Allen received the degrees of Masonry in 1996 in Canton Lodge No. 77, Canton, Georgia. He served as Worshipful Master in 2002. He is also a member of Georgia Mountain Lodge No. 758 and served as its Worshipful Master in 2010.

Companion Allen was exalted in Canton Chapter No. 135, Royal Arch Masons in 1998, and served as High Priest in 2000. He received the Order of High Priesthood in 2000.

He was greeted in Canton Council No. 3, Royal and Select Masters, in 1998 and served as Illustrious Master in 2001. He received the Order of Silver Trowel in 2002. Companion Allen was elected Illustrious Grand Steward at the 2006 Annual Assembly of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of the State of Georgia. and served through the line, being elected Most Illustrious Grand Master at the 2011 Annual Assembly.

Sir Knight Allen was knighted in Amicalola Commandery No. 41 Knights Templar in 1998 and served as Eminent Commander in 2004. He received the Knight Crusader of the Cross in 2004.

He is a member of the Scottish Rite, Valley of Atlanta, joining in 1997. He was invested with the rank and decoration of a Knight Commander Court of Honour in 2009

Companion Allen was inducted as a Knight York Cross of Honour in 2005 in Cherokee Rose Priory No. 56. He belongs to Rufus White Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine, Luther G. Palmer York Rite College No. 123, Atlanta, Georgia and Carl F. Lester, Jr. Council No. 65 of Knight Masons where he is serving in the line.

Brother Allen also belongs to the Tall Cedars of Lebanon, Georgia State Forest No. 181 and is a Past Grand Tall Cedar of that Forest.

#### **BILL NO 1**

A BILL, to amend Section 2.4.1 Paragraph (4) and Paragraph (6) of the Grand Council Code of Georgia relating to Grand Council fees and funds

BE IT ENACTED by the Grand Council of Royal & Select Masters for the State of Georgia that Code Section 2.4.1 be amended by deleting the amount of "\$7,00" therein and substituting in lieu thereof "\$15.00", with changes emboldened and underlined, so that when amended it will read:

- 2.4.1 General Fees The revenue of this Grand Council shall be derived from the Following sources:
  - For each dispensation to form and open a new Council there shall be paid the sum of thirty-five dollars, which must accompany the petition. No extra fee shall be charged when the Charter is granted.
  - For each Special Dispensation to receive, read and ballot on petitions for the degrees at one and the same time at a Special Assembly the fee shall be \$2.00; For special dispensations for any other purpose the fee shall be \$2.00.
  - Should this Grand Council grant a Charter to petitioners direct, who have not worked under dispensation, the fee shall be thirty-five dollars, which must accompany the petition.
  - 4. For each Select Master whose name is on roll as of December 31, \$15.00 plus any assessments levied by General Grand Council, shall be paid to this Grand council as dues, except as is hereinafter provided.
  - 5. For each Select Master's degree conferred, the Constituent Council, whether Chartered or Under Dispensation, shall pay \$4.00.
  - 6. For each reinstatement, a fee of \$15.00 shall be paid to this Grand Council.
  - 7. The fees enumerated in Paragraphs 2, 4, 5, and 6 of this Section must be paid to the Office of the Grand Recorder-Treasurer before March 1 of each year. Constituent councils failing to make payment as aforesaid shall be assessed a penalty of 10 percent for such delinquency.



To: The Officers and Companions of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Georgia

The Cryptic Masons Medical Research Foundation (CMMRF), under your generous support and philanthropy, continues to foster multidisciplinary research at the Indiana Center for Vascular Biology and Medicine (ICVBM); based out of Indianapolis, Indiana at the Indiana University School of Medicine and the Roudebush VA Hospital. Although ICVBM is headquartered in Indiana, their efforts and results continue to impact medicine and touch lives, globally. Your support continues to save lives and promote research

which may provide prevention, treatments and cures for a wide breath of diseases and conditions all linked to a cornerstone, blood vessels and the biology of adult stem cells.

The use of adult stem cells, derived from readily-available tissues such as fat, bone marrow, cord blood, and menstrual blood, are not ethically controversial as are embryonic cells. Embryonic cells have one mission, to build babies, NOT to just repair or regenerate the cells that are "broken". Adult stem cells are more specific to their task at hand; grow muscle, build blood vessels, sprout nerves, etc. They are safe, reliable, and may be stored or shared between patients without many of the problems found with organ transplantations.

During ICVBM's initial investigations into the mechanisms behind clogged or hardened arteries, it was realized that our bodies contain little repair stations (stem cells) associated with blood and blood vessels. Their research has expanded to involve partners from multiple clinical and basic science departments, as well as hospital, industrial and academic external collaborators and partners.

#### ON THE HORIZION 2012-2013 AT ICVBM

The goals that ICVBM specifically like to address with new support directed to the vascular and adult stem cell initiatives, will include:

- Testing the effects of one's own fat-derived (adipose) stem cells on the progression to diabetes in children in the early stages of juvenile onset diabetes and adults with Type 2 diabetes.
- Developing and improving new models of islet transplantation which may be able to reverse diabetes in some patients.
- Creating the ability to watch vessels providing blood flow to transplanted islets in real time.
- Building a bank of fat-derived stem cells from patients with and without diabetes to determine the effects of diabetes on one's own stem cells.
- Investigating the ability of fat-derived stem cells to reverse kidney damage associated with diabetes.
- Retinopathy leads to blindness in both diabetes and macular degeneration. We believe that both problems may be addressed with fat-derived (vascular) stem cells that may have the ability to stabilize new blood vessels in the eye, and they are prepared to test this concept.
- Addressing lung disease known as adult respiratory distress syndrome (ARDS). This occurs in the ICU, and has no good treatment. Their results in COPD suggest to us that this is a very viable target, such that we might be able to save patients with ARDS very soon, if preclinical models support this idea.
- Application of potentially therapeutic treatments to those with hemophilia. They have determined that adipose stem cells can be modified to become similar to liver cells and to secrete the factors needed for hemophilia treatment. They plan to take the findings in hemophilia from the laboratory to preclinical studies, to determine whether this concept can work in vivo.
- Collaborations with Urology and Neurology colleagues to apply their findings to help patients who have erectile dysfunction after certain types of prostate surgery for cancer, and this ED does not respond to drugs like Viagra. There is significant evidence suggesting that fat-

- derived (vascular) stem cells could reverse this problem by enhancing nerve sprouting to the penis.
- Expanding our fat-derived (vascular) stem cells may well also address
  certain types of arthritis, like rheumatoid arthritis. They would like to
  try this in initial preclinical studies; and move into patients as soon as
  feasible, if supported by the studies. It is also anticipated the initiation
  of clinical trials in the area of osteoarthritis, where substantial
  preclinical data has already been accumulated.

We at CMMRF are excited about the advancements and expansion occurring at ICVBM. We hope you will visit us at <a href="http://www.cmmrf.org">http://www.cmmrf.org</a> /to learn more.

Your Foreign Correspondent has received and reviewed the Annual Proceedings of numerous Grand Councils. Many of these are in CD format, and more jurisdictions have their proceedings available on their website.

#### **REPORT OF CHARTERS & BY-LAWS COMMITTEE**

To the Most Illustrious Grand Master, Grand Officers, and Members of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of the State of Georgia:

Your committee on Charters and By-Laws wishes to make the following report:

We recommend the approval of the complete revision of the By-Laws of Winder Council No.77, R.S.M which also includes a change in the meeting place from Winder, Georgia to Auburn, Georgia. The Grand Council has issued Dispensation # 7 dated February 21,2012 for the Council to begin meeting there as such, the Most Illustrious Grand Master has approved the move.

We recommend the approval of the amendment of the By-Laws of Minor C. Shadburnm, Jr. Council No. 49, R.S.M., changing the meeting day from Tuesday to Wednesday because of area lodge conflicts.

Your committee notes that the Charter of Franklin Council No. 50 at Lavonia was forfeited on October 19, 2011. The 18 members of the Council had previously been issued dimits from Fred E. Lee Chapter No. 86 in April of 2011 and having not affliated with another chapter, there were no Royal Arch members remaining in the Council.

Your committee has received a change in the By-Laws of Zabud Council No. 64, changing the fees and dues. Your committee will approve the suggested fees and dues. However, the second sentence of the new change that reads "Any member in arrears for 24consecutive months shall be dropped from the roll of membership in the Council" is in direct conflict with Section 2.8.6.2.2 and 2.8.6.2.3 and 2.8.6.2.4 of the the 1995 Grand Council Code which prescribes how a companion shall be suspended. The committee is unable to approve this sentence of the new change. Please delete it or rewrite it to conform to the code.

This committee has received no requests for new Council charters. However, we note that for good and sufficient cause, the Most Illustrious Grand Master has issued His Dispensation on March 19, 2012 authorizing certain Companions, exceeding the required 9 in number, to meet as a Council of Royal and Select Masters under the name of Covenant Council U/D in the city of Warner Robins, county of Houston. We therefore recommend that this Dispensation continue until the next annual Assembly, unless sooner terminated by the Most Illustrious Grand Master or by the Companions, when they may wish to apply for a charter. Your committee is duly impressed that the Petition contains the names of 21 Royal Arch Masons who want to be Council members as required by the code.

#### **JAMES E. STEVENS - PERSONAL**

This new commandment, to love, was not new. People who lived before Jesus came and people untouched by the Christian gospel knew it was better to

- 1. Better to love than to hate,
- 2. Better to tell the truth than to lie.
- 3. Better to protect human life than to kill.

What then is new about this commandment? We are to love one another as Jesus has loved us.

The Apostle Paul tells us of the depth of Christ's love in his letter to the church at Rome (5:6-10):

- 1. While we were still helpless, Christ died for us.
- 2. While we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.
- 3. While we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son.

Paul wrote to the Christians at Ephesus: "Walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God." (5:2)

#### Three observations:

Christian life and Christian faith must never be separated.

Take for example, the Ten Commandments. The first 4 are concerned with our relationship with God, while the remaining 6 are concerned with our relationship with people. The 1<sup>st</sup> 4 are religious, the last 6 are ethical. Jesus said great religion is fulfilled in love of God and love of neighbor. Love of God is theological; love of neighbor is ethical. One of our great tragedies is that we often try to separate faith and Christian ethics. But that is like trying to separate the back and palm of my hand. It can't be done, and if I should try I would succeed only in getting a mutilated hand. If we separate faith and ethics, we get a mutilated gospel.

On the other hand, there are many who are greatly concerned about their fellow man and social action, but care little or nothing about the Christian faith. The tragedy here is that their concerns are cut off from the source, the soil that nurtures it, and the springs that renew it.

When we get too far from the source and springs of renewal of the Christian life, we may be overcome by our own weariness and fatigue. The Christian life is the result of our salvation, not the cause. We are saved by grace, not by our best and greatest work. We don't win God's acceptance by being good. I bring empty hands to God, and I say to him, "I have nothing to bring to you. I wish I had full hands. I would like to bring you many good works.

God looks at me and says a most wonderful thing. "Your empty hands are enough. If you had all the good works in the world, you couldn't buy my salvation. It is a free gift." Paul said to the Ephesians, salvation is "not a result of good works that no one should boast. . . . [We are] created in Christ Jesus for good works." (2:9-10) Finally, our Christian life is to be tested and judged by our life style. Going back to the New Commandment. I am afraid, and it is especially true in my own denomination, that we put far too much emphasis on making certain we dot our theological "I"s and cross our theological "T"s correctly and ignore too much what Jesus said in this new

We are to love one another. If we are not right with another person or a Brother, we cannot be right with God. The failure to love our brother is proof that we do not love God. John wrote in one of his epistles: "If any one says, 'I love God,' and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, cannot love God who he has not seen." (1 John 4:20)

But how is that possible?

commandment.

We must remember the source of our love and be firmly connected to it. God loved us first. "We love him." John told us. "because he first loved us." (1 John 4:19).

We are connected to God's love through the work of the Holy Spirit. "God's love," Paul wrote, "has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit which has been given to us." (Rom. 5:5)

But Lord, I ask again? How is that possible? I live in a world that is hostile and broken, how is it possible that I should love in spite of the kind of world in which I live?

- 1. I must be connected to the source of the strength that makes it possible: Jesus Christ.
- 2. I must find a loving, forgiving, and supportive fellowship in the church.
- 3. I must associate with fellow believers who are seeking to live out the new commandment.
- 4. If you and I do that, we can live out the new commandment.
